New requirements for Recognized Shows: Effective October 1, 2002 all horses need either a Lifetime USDF Horse Registration Number or Horse Identification number (\$20). Every rider/owner must have either a USDF Non-

member card (first card is free) or USDF member card. As of December 1, 2002 all horse must have a USA Equestrian Horse ID number. USA Equestrian Horse ID numbers are free until December 2003. General Information

It is the rider's responsibility to check the accuracy of the scores and horse and rider names recorded by the TDC Awards Committee.

Discrepancies must be reported to the TDC Awards Committee by the fifteenth of the month following the show report. Scores may be verified in the TDC Newsletter "Transitions" or on the TDC website at www.tucsondressageclub.org

Show Year

October 1, 2001 thru
September 30, 2002

Eligible Shows

All USAEquestrian/USDF recognized shows will count towards yearend Recognized Show Awards.

All TDC recognized schooling shows will count toward yearend Schooling Show Awards.

Eligible shows include but are not limited to, all TDC shows, CARA shows, ADA shows, and Open shows held in conjunction with State Championships or Regional Championships. Ineligible shows include, but are not limited to, breed-restricted shows, State Championships, and Regional Championship.

Recognized shows and schooling shows will be tallied and awarded separately.

Eligible horses

Owners of all horses must be current TDC members in good standing at the time of the show for scores to be eligible. A member in good standing is defined as one whose paid membership has been recorded by the TDC Membership Chairperson.

Horses may be of any age, sex, or breed unless otherwise specified in an individual award description.

Owners

Please pay extra attention to how your information is filled out on each entry blank and to how that information is recorded by the show secretary. The horse's name must be entered the same way on each entry blank for the scores to count. The horse's name must be recorded the same way for each ride. If there is a name or status change during the show season, please notify the Awards Chairperson immediately. Example: an Arabian who earns a Legion of Honor during the year would change its name from Star to Star+.

Eligible Riders

All riders must be current TDC members in good standing at the time of the show for

scores to be eligible. A member in good standing is defined as one whose paid membership has been recorded by the TDC membership Chairperson. Riders may be of any age or sex unless otherwise specified in an individual award description.

It is the rider's responsibility to notify the Awards Chairperson of any changes that effect yearend award status.

Such changes include, but are not limited to, a change in status (Open to Amateur); or horse name change. Failure to notify the Awards Committee Chairperson of any changes may result in the loss of the award.

Scores

All scores for the yearend awards are tabulated using percentage scores earned by **each horse / rider combination** throughout the show year at each level and in each division.

Maiden Horse and Maiden Rider classes do not count for yearend awards.

The top six scores earned in at least three shows will be used to tabulate the awards in the

Recognized Show division for the USAEquestrian Training through Fourth Levels.

The top three scores earned in at least three shows will be used to tabulate the awards in the Recognized Show Division for the FEI levels.

The top six scores earned in at least three schooling shows will be used to tabulate the awards in the Schooling Show Division in introductory– Second levels. All awards will be presented at the TDC Yearend Awards Banquet held in October. For further details on award requirements, please refer to specific award descriptions or contact the TDC Awards Chairperson.

Recognized Show Awards (USAEquestrian/USDF)

Adult Amateur

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Adult Amateur horse/rider combinations for USAEquestrian Training through Fourth Levels. Champion through sixth place will be awarded at each level.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC Recognized Shows per level are required. The six best scores per level for the horse/rider combinations will be used.

A rider shall compete as an Adult Amateur from the beginning of the calendar year in which s/he reaches the age of 22. (See USAEquestrian Rules, Article 1919.3).

The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level.

Junior

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Junior horse/rider combinations for USAEquestrian Training through Fourth Levels. Champion through sixth place will be awarded at each level.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC Recognized Shows per level are required. The six best scores per level for the horse/rider combinations will be used.

A rider shall compete as an Junior until the calendar year in which s/he reaches the age of 22. (See USAEquestrian Rules, Article 1919.3).

The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level.

Open

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Open horse/rider combinations for USAEquestrian Training through Fourth Levels. Champion through sixth place will be awarded at each level.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC Recognized Shows per level are required. The six best scores per level for the horse/rider combinations will be used.

The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level.

FEI

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to horse/rider combinations for Young Rider, Prix St. George, Intermediare I, Intermediare II, and Grand Prix. Champion through sixth place will be awarded. The FEI Division will be split among Open, Adult Amateur,

and Junior Divisions.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC Recognized Shows per level are required. The three best scores per level for the horse/rider combinations will be used.

The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level, with the exception of Grand Prix.

Musical Freestyle

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to horse/rider combinations for any level Musical Freestyle class. Champion through sixth place will be awarded.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC Recognized Shows per level are required. The three best scores for the horse/rider combinations will be used.

The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level.

Freestyle scores **DO NOT** count towards level awards except in the Freestyle Division.

Arabian Award

Awarded to the horse, either pure-bred or half-Arabian, with the highest average of two scores. One score must be earned at a TDC November show and one score must be earned at a TDC May show. Scores may be earned at any level with any rider. Both owner and rider of the horse must be TDC members in good standing at the time the scores are earned.

High Point Rider Awards

Adult Amateur

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Adult Amateur riders for any Level (Training through Grand Prix) with the highest average of scores. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded at each level.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC Recognized Shows are required. The six best scores on all horses of any Adult Amateur rider in an Adult Amateur class will be averaged.

A rider shall compete as an Adult Amateur from the beginning of the calendar year in which s/he reaches the age of 22.

Junior/Young Rider

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Junior/Young riders for any Level with the highest average of scores. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded at each level.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC Recognized Shows are required. The six best scores on all horses of any Junior/Young rider in any junior/young rider class will be averaged.

A rider shall compete as a Junior/Young rider until the calendar year in which s/he reaches the age of 22.

Open

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Open riders for any Level with the highest average of scores. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded at each level.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC

Recognized Shows are required. The six best scores on all horses of any Open rider in an Open class will be averaged.

Open Riders are not eligible to receive Junior or Adult Amateur awards.

Rookie Rider Award

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to a rider at either Training or First Level who has never competed in more than three recognized dressage shows in a given year. The rider may have shown in other equestrian disciplines prior to showing in dressage. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded. Rider must be either a Junior or Adult Amateur.

Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC recognized shows are required. The six best scores on all horses of the rider at Training level or First Level will be averaged.

Vintage Rider Award

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to the Vintage Rider for any level with the highest scores. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded. Three USAEquestrian/USDF/TDC-recognized shows are required. The six best scores on all horses of any level will be averaged.

A Vintage Rider is anyone who is 50 years or older as of January 1 during the awards year.

Schooling Show Awards

Amateur

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Adult Amateur horse/rider combinations for each level of Introductory through Second Level. Champion through sixth place will be awarded for each level.

Three TDC-recognized schooling shows per level are required. The

best six scores per level for the horse/rider combination will be used.

A rider shall compete as an Adult Amateur from the beginning of the calendar year in which s/he reaches the age of 22.

The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level.

Junior

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Junior horse/rider combinations for each level of Introductory through Second Level. Champion through sixth place will be awarded for each level.

Three TDC-recognized schooling shows per level are required. The best six scores per level for the horse/rider combination will be used.

A rider shall compete as a Junior until the calendar year in which s/he reaches the age of 22.

The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level with the exception of Grand Prix.

Open

Yearend awards and recognition will be given to Open horse/rider combinations for each level of Introductory through Second Level. Champion through sixth place will be awarded for each level.

Three TDC-recognized schooling shows per level are required. The best six scores per level for the horse/rider combination will be used.

Open riders are not eligible to receive Junior or Amateur awards.

The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level.

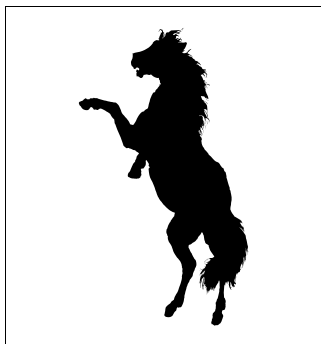

Strangles

Strangles – the sound of the word sends chills up every horse owner's spine. Every stable owner runs for the bottle of disinfectant. Sleepless nights await a rider waiting for the incubation period to pass hoping their horse doesn't contract the terrifying, mysterious disease. But like anything that is mysterious and terrifying, a little knowledge can put one's mind at ease, or at least make things a little more bearable.

Strangles is the name of an equine respiratory disease caused by the bacteria streptococcus equi. The disease is highly contagious with a low mortality rate. It is spread by direct contact with an infected horse or with the nasal discharge from an infected horse. The incubation period for the disease, the time from exposure until symptoms are seen, is 2-6 days. Classic symptoms of the disease include a high fever, a thick, yellow nasal discharge and swollen lymph nodes under the jaw, however other lymph nodes can be affected as well.

Although the bacteria that causes strangles can only live in the environment a short time, infected horses can shed the bacteria for up to 6 weeks. The course of the disease is usually about 3 weeks. Strangles is usually a disease of younger horses up to 5

years of age. However, older horses can contract the disease and horses can contract the disease more than once in a lifetime.

There are as many treatments for strangles as there are veterinarians. Usually the treatment depends on the severity of the disease and the effect it is having on the horse. Generally, swollen lymph nodes are hot packed until they rupture or until they can be lanced and flushed. The bacteria is very sensitive to penicillin, so high doses of penicillin are usually used at some point during the treatment. It has been shown that penicillin can also help prevent the disease in a healthy horse if given before and during the period the horse is exposed. If the horse is off feed or is having trouble swallowing, anti-inflammatories such as phenylbutazone (bute) are used to keep the horse comfortable.

Proper veterinary care is important due to potential complications from inadequate treatment. Lymph nodes can become infected in other areas of the body if the bacteria is not eliminated. This condition is often referred to as "bastard strangles" and poses a potentially fatal complication if the abscess should rupture into the body cavity. Purpura hemorrhagica is another

complication of strangles in which severe edema (swelling) of the legs and hemorrhage in the gums pose a very painful situation for the horse.

The risk of contracting the disease can be reduced by vaccination. The newer intranasal vaccine is more effective than previous intramuscular injections. To prevent infection of additional horses on a premise where there is already a sick horse, isolation of the sick horse or horses is necessary. Common equipment such as pitch forks or feed buckets should not be shared with the sick horses. Cleaning the affected horses stall with dilute bleach may help cut down on the spread of the disease. Like most diseases, each individual case of strangles varies with the horse. Your veterinarian should always assess the case so that the optimum treatment can be given.

Just keep in mind that strangles is unlikely to be fatal, but if not treated properly, the sequelae can be devastating down the road.

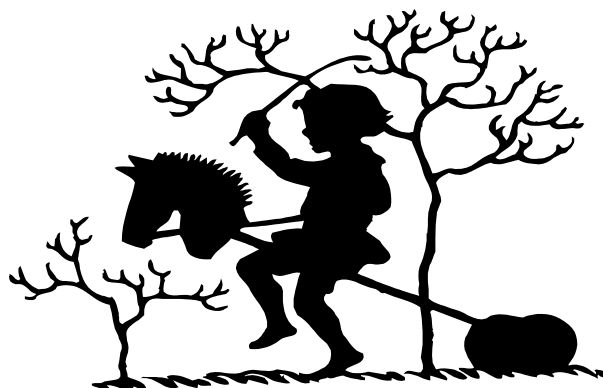

Ellie Stein-Masek was also participating in both shows, when her horse Ascott became ill on Friday. He is fine now, but everyone knows that when the vet recommends taking your horse to the hospital it means trouble. With all that stress, Ellie still came back to the show and won state champion on her client's horse.

I want us all to think of our trainers, how they take us through events, and take us where we need to be even when

the stress is so high that fear is the only emotion available.

Ellie went way past her job description.

I hold you in high respect.

OOPS! YEAREND AWARD CORRECTIONS

The Yearend Awards Information that appeared in the October 2002 newsletter has some errors. Please correct your copies.

1. Title

The year printed was October 1, - September 30, 2002. The year should be October 1, 2002 - September 30, 2003.

2. Title; revision
Take off that line

3. Show Year

The show year printed was October 1 thru September 30, 2002. It should be October 1, 2002, through September 30, 2003.

3. Scores

Paragraph printed: "The top six scores earned in at least three shows will be used . . ."

It should be revised to read: "The top six scores earned in at least three RECOGNIZED shows will be used . . ."

Paragraph printed: "The top three scores earned in at least three shows will be used . . ." It should be revised to read: "The top three scores earned in at least three RECOGNIZED shows will be used . . ."

Paragraph printed: "The top six scores earned in at least three schooling shows will be used . . ." This is where the musical freestyles at schooling shows should be specifically singled out as NOT counting. Putting it in the Musical Freestyle section under Recognized Show Awards does nothing to clarify Schooling Shows.

The paragraph should read: "The top six scores earned per level at Introductory, Training, First, or Second Level will be used to tabulate Schooling Show Awards. Musical Freestyles performed at schooling shows do not count toward schooling show level awards.

4. Recognized Show Awards/Open
There use to be a paragraph that stated: "Only scores earned in open classes will be used to calculate these awards." It's not in the October 2002 version. Was it omitted intentionally or omitted in error?

[This would be an accident. For the different divisions \(Open, AA, Jr\) in both Recognized and Schooling Shows, there needs to be a sentence that says "Only scores earned in Open \(or AA, or Jr\) classes will be used to calculate these awards."](#)

Also, this paragraph should technically be added to the Adult Amateur and Junior sections. For the FEI section, since the division was split, the same rule holds. I believe the paragraph should be stated because we do have members who ride multiple levels.

5. Musical Freestyle

It is not obvious by the wording in this section that all divisions and levels are lumped into one category, i.e., there is no split in the divisions or levels.

[Under this heading, we need to say something along the lines of, the Musical Freestyle award is not divided by level or division.](#)

Also, the addition of the paragraph "Freestyle scores DO

NOT count towards level awards except in the Freestyle Division" would lead someone to think that the divisions and levels for freestyle are NOT lumped together into one category.

6. Vintage Rider Award

The paragraph printed said, "A Vintage Rider is anyone who is 50 years or older as of January 1 during the awards year."

That was changed per my records. The paragraph should state: "A Vintage Rider is anyone who is 50 years or older as of October 1st of the current competition year."

[This is the correct rule.](#)

7. Schooling Show Awards, Open
The paragraph printed said, "Yearend awards . . . For each level of Introductory through Second Level. . . ."

Trainers can't ride Introductory Level at schooling shows.

[This is also correct.](#)

The paragraph should state: ". . . for each level of Training through Second Level. . . ."

8. In each section, most sections include this paragraph: "The award may not be won more than three times by the same horse/rider combination at the same level."

What does this mean?

[This simply means that, if I have won Training Level Open on Neblig in 2000, 2001, & 2002, I can't win it again in 2003. If I had simply placed on Neblig at Training Open each of these years, or even won, was Reserve, and won again, then I could win again in 2003.](#)
