CONSERVATOR'S QUARTERLY REPORT TO THE COURT

Pursuant to this Court's order appointing Conservator entered on August 9, 2002, the Conservator hereby files the following quarterly report apprising the Court of the progress of the Conservatorship since his last report dated April 29, 2005.

I. Administration

1. Over the past couple of months, the Conservator has been working with Anderton Family Enterprises, LLC ("AFE") to make the scheduled premium payments on all policies pursuant to the purchase and sale agreement approved by the Court. AFE is currently past due on making payments for October's premium payments.

2. The Conservator and AFE closed a transaction to sell HIV policies with a face value of approximately \$15,000,000.00 for a purchase price of \$1,950,000.00. This transaction resulted in an additional \$1,462,500.00 which was received by the estate, in mid-August, for distribution.

3. The Conservator expects to obtain approval from the Court for a second distribution and anticipates a second distribution to begin in January 2006.

4. The Conservator estimates that less than 100 unsettled claims remain from the first distribution. These claims require additional documentation from investors and requests for that documentation have been sent to the investors or their heirs. The claims are being resolved as the requested documentation is received by the Conservator. The Conservator is also in the process of addressing approximately 300 inquiries (what the Conservator calls "post-production inquiries") from investors that have already received a check or a letter with questions about their distribution. The Conservator is resolving these inquiries by means of explanatory letters or telephone calls, where appropriate. An updated summary report showing data regarding active, matured, legal, lapsed and terminated policies, excluding the HIV policies sold in August, is attached as Exhibit "A." An updated report reflecting the current financial position of the estate is attached as Exhibit "B."

5. The Conservator has continued to update his website and outgoing telephone message apprising investors of the current status of the estate.

II. Litigation

1. The Conservator, through Counsel, has continued discovery with Fidelity and Deposit Company of Maryland ("F&D"), the insurer for the theft of funds bond.

2. The Conservator, through counsel, continues to monitor several lawsuits and arbitration proceedings filed against Future First or The Fidelity Trust. Several new lawsuits have been filed and served on the Conservator. When necessary, the Conservator has engaged local counsel to assist with attempts to stay these actions. An updated list of active litigation and arbitration proceedings filed against Future First is attached as Exhibit "C."


3. Depositions are being scheduled in the lawsuit filed against Dr. Michael J. Duffy.

4. On January 7, 2004, the Conservatorship was extended to include F.T. International, Ltd. A tentative settlement has been reached in the action styled *F.T. International, Ltd. v. First Union*

National Bank, Civil Action No. 01-A-06149-2. A motion to approve the settlement has been filed and is scheduled for hearing on October 12, 2005.

The above box accounts for payments to be made to AFE and Moran in the next two weeks. In addition to those payments, we are in the process of collecting 8 more maturities worth a total of \$602,620.35. Of that amount, \$301,310.18 will go to AFE, \$6,026.20 will go to Tom Moran, and \$295,283.97 will go to the Conservator. Upon the additional receipt and distribution of these maturities, the Conservator's death benefit account balance is projected to be \$4,611,598.17. Upon receipt of these amounts the Conservator's total non-distribution assets are projected to be \$4,826,780.17. The Citibank Distribution Account are has been reduced from \$4,000,000 to its current balance as a result of distributions to investors.
