Camping in a tree: Tent caterpillars have been showing up at Grand Teton National Park and in Teton Canyon this summer. The critters are normal this time of year, said Ben Eborn, extension agent with the University of Idaho. "There is no need to worry about them unless they are in a tree in your yard," he said. "They are easily removed with a pair of pruning shears. Chemical control is also an option. The trick is getting the insecticide inside the tent." Options include Neem oil, BT (*Bacillus thuringiensis*), carbaryl, permethrin and spinosad.
