Bailout – Giving hundreds of millions of federal dollars to poorly run businesses that are going to fail so that their implosion is even grander.

Commander and Chief – 1.) The President of the United States 2.) A person who should be man enough to resign if he cannot even command good intel from his own staff.

Conservative – 1.) A party which works to reduce government spending by effective means of fiscal control and wise investment. This applies to neither party. Republicans are dually excluded. 2.) In a more traditional sense, a conservative works to uphold the Constitution and its laws. This also applies to neither party. 3.) Any party which endorsed the Patriot Act, which removes the right of Habeas Corpus, or voted to support the War with Iraq without discussion or debate has ignored the principles of the Constitution. Contradiction in Action – Saying one thing and doing another. Example, speaking out against a brutal dictatorship in Iraq while giving financial and military aid to brutal dictatorships in Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, and Algeria.

Democrat – 1.) A political party that presumably is concerned with the views and opinions of the majority of the population. Any individual who believes a poll of 1003 people represents the views of 280 million better than a few million marching on your front lawn, need not apply. 2.) A group with no core ideology (see Liberal 1)

Department of Homeland Security – 1.) \$20 billion color chart 2.) Poor return on investment 3.) Job security for duct tape manufacturers everywhere.

Hypocrite – Any individual or party who believes that the lies that Clinton told, which got NO Americans killed or injured, constitute an impeachable offense, and the lies Bush told, which have currently gotten 200+ Americans killed and thousands injured, do not.

Liberal –1.) A group who is too weak to organize effectively; patsies 2.) In the context of the last two decades, a flagrant federal over-spender. In this case the term should apply to Republicans who have consistently raised the national debt by enormous amounts beyond Democratic spending.
