1<sup>st</sup> Wills of Marion County, In., 1856-1859

I, Asa B. Harris, of the Count of Marion and State of Indiana, do make and publish this my last will and testament. First. I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, and I further desire that my beloved wife Jane shall have the proceeds arising from my farm during her natural life, or widowhood. I also desire that all just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my personal property, and the remainder I give to my beloved wife Jane. I further desire that my executor or executors do appropriate all they can to the good raising and education of my minor children and further that after my death or marriage of my beloved wife, Jane, that my land and personal property be sold, my land to be sold, and a credit of six, twelve, and eighteen months and well secured by notes and security. My personal property, such as may remain to be sold on credit of nine months, and the proceeds arising from such sales when collected to be equally divided amongst all my children. And I further appoint my beloved wife Jane and Benjamin Morgan, executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I set my hand and seal the 4d day of February 1849. A. B. Harris (seal)

In the Probate Court of Indiana Marion County, appeared Harbert Harris and John Pugh, of the County aforesaid and of lawful age who being duly sworn, upon their oaths depose and say that Asa B. Harris, executed, signed, sealed, published, and declared the within instrument of writing to be his last will and testament, on the day of the date thereof, that said Asa B. Harris was of the full age of twentyone years at the making and publishing thereof of sound mind and memory and not under coercion or restraint as they believe. That said last will and testament was so made, executed, signed, sealed, published, and declared by the testator in the presence of affiant and Wesley Willson, who at the request of the testator signed their names to the same as witnesses thereto in the presence of the testator. and in the presence of each other, and further say not. Harris, of the County of Marion and State of Indiana, do make and publish this my last will and testament: First, I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, and I further desire that my beloved wife - Jane, shall have the proceeds arising from my farm during her natural life, or widowhood. I also desire that all just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my personal property, and the remainder I give to my beloved wife, Jane. I further desire that my executors or administrators do appropriate all they can to the good raising such education of my minor children, and further that after the death or marriage of my beloved wife Jane, that my land and personal property be sold, my land to be sold, and a credit given, twelve, and eighteen months and well secured by notes and property remaining. My personal property, such as may remain, to be sold on a credit of nine months, and the proceeds arising from such sales when collected to be equally divided amongst all my children. And I further appoint my beloved wife Sarah and Benjamin Morgan executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I set my hand and seal this 3<sup>d</sup> day of February 1859.

Lewis arrived in Madison Co, Ia. in 1854 from Indiana by wagon, settling in Monroe Twp. where he obtained 160 acres of land. His father made the trip with him and spent the remainder of his life there.

History of Madison County, Iowa (pg.575)

L.J. Harris, deceased, was a well known farmer of Monroe township, and those who were associated with him held him in high esteem. He was born in Indiana on the 14<sup>th</sup> of September, 1830, and was a son of Harvard Harris, a landowner of that state. He was married in the Hoosier state on the 14<sup>th</sup> of September, 1853, to Miss Sarah E. Berry, who was born in Marion county, Indiana, on the 6<sup>th</sup> of March, 1833. In 1854 they came by wagon to Madison county and settled in Monroe township, where Mr. Harris entered one hundred and sixty acres of land. His father made the journey with him and spent the remainder of his life in this county.

L.J. Harris erected a log house upon his farm and in this the family resided until 1861, when he built the residence which is still the home of his widow. As the years passed he made many improvements upon his place, bringing it to a high state of development. He was not afraid of hard work and long hours and his well directed industry was rewarded by abundant crops, the sale of which netted him a good profit on his year's work. He also raised livestock and found that a remunerative phase of his business.

To Mr. and Mrs. Harris were born eleven children; Lucy Louisa, born March 1, 1857, who became the wife of T. E. Weeks and is now deceased; William I., born March 3, 1859, who resides in South Dakota; M. E., born September 19, 1861, who is a farmer of Webster township, this county; Martha Ann, deceased, who was born July 2, 1863, and became the wife of Byron Miller; Harbert H., who was born on the 10<sup>th</sup> of December, 1864 and died in infancy; Charles, deceased, whose birth occurred on the 25<sup>th</sup> of February, 1866; and infant who died unnamed; Sarah Frances, who was born on the 6<sup>th</sup> of March, 1868, and married L. A. Eldridge, a farmer of South township; Zeresh E., born February 1, 1871, who married Walter Skinner, of Newton, Ia.; and Joseph E., who was born on the 2d of December, 1874, and is living in Newton.

Mr. Harris was a republican and served as township trustee and as constable. He was a good citizen and in the private relation of life manifested admirable traits of character. His work as a farmer was crowned with well deserved success and he became one of the representative men of his township. He died on the 1<sup>st</sup> of April, 1903, and was sincerely mourned not only by his family but by many friends and acquaintances.

Mrs. Harris still resides upon the homestead which is operated by a grandson, Louis Irvin Weeks, whom she reared to manhood, as his mother died when he was but an infant. He was born on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May, 1879, and married Miss Maud Miles, by whom he has three daughters, Veva Elizabeth, Ruby Rosalie and Gertrude Faye. Mr. Weeks recently purchased a farm in Nebraska but intends to continue his residence in this county.

Mrs. Harris takes great pleasure in recounting the stories of the early days in this part of the state and it seems almost unbelievable to one of the present generation that only fifty or sixty years ago such conditions as she tells of existed. At the time there were no roads and the old Indian trail which passed west of her home was the only highway in the neighborhood. There were no bridges across the river, which necessitated this being forded, and in times of high water it was very dangerous to attempt to cross. Winterset was but a small village and there was not a house between North Clanton and South Clanton. The principal crop raised was wheat, which was cut with a sickle and tramped out with horses. The grain when so separated from the chaff was at first taken to Indianola to be ground into flour, although later the Buffalo Mills were established in this county. In that early day the wheat

was often severely infected with a disease known as smut, so much so that the flour and the bisquits made therefrom were black. Indians were numerous although not hostile and Mrs. Harris was afraid of them. On one occasion her husband and father-in-law went to Ronggold county to look at land but as Indians were numerous there her husband remarked "It would be no use to try to fetch Sally down here". During the early part of their residence in Madison county their only artificial light was from grease lamps and candles and when Mr. Harris brought home a glass lamp which burned kerosene Mrs. Harris was fearful that it might be dangerous and was unwilling to use it. While a girl living in Marion county, Indiana, she saw the first train enter that county and a number of years later witnessed the arrival of the first train in this county. Although she has reached the advanced year of eighty two years she is still hale and hearty and takes great interest in all that is going on around her. Her reminiscences of the early days are not only of interest but also of value as they enable the men and women of today to realize more clearly the sacrifices that the early settlers made in laying the foundation of the present prosperity of the county.
