NORTH DAKOTA'S CAPITOL BUILDING
WAS BUILT ON A BLUFF OVERLOOKING
THE CITY OF BISMARCK AND THE
MISSOURI RIVER VALLEY. DESIGN OF
THE CAPITOL WAS COMPLETED IN
1930-31 BY ARCHITECTS HOLABIRD
AND ROOT. CONSTRUCTION OF THE
BUILDING WAS COMPLETED IN 1934
AT A COST OF JUST \$2,000,000. THE
STEEL FRAMEWORK IS COVERED

WITH WHITE INDIANA LIMESTONE AND REFLECTS THE ART DECO ARCHITECTURE THAT BECAME POPULAR IN THE 1930'S. THE 19 STORY "SKYSCRAPER" HAS 80% USABLE SPACE AND AN INTERIOR DECORATED WITH A BLEND OF FOREIGN AND DOMESTIC MATERIALS. IT HOUSES THE LEGISLATIVE WING, THE MEMORIAL HALL, THE EXECUTIVE TOWER WITH STATE OFFICES, THE THEODORE ROSEVEVELT ROUGHRIDER HALL OF FAME AND THE JUDICIAL WING.
