Set up time will be from 7:00am to 9:00. Please send your contract back as soon as possible to assure yourself of a space. If cancellation is necessary, it should be made as soon as possible so the space may be reassigned. Space fees on cancellation will be refunded up to seven(7) days prior to the show date.

The New Jersey Antique Bottle Club will provide No Insurance or accept any responsibility for breakage or loss of merchandise. You must park in vendors lot after done unloading or risk chance of being towed or ticketed or both.

Ample parking is provided on premises and admission is free. Cars will be allowed in the park for loading And unloading only. Overnight lodging is available at the Hammonton Ramada Inn (609-561-5700) approximately 7.5 miles from Batsto on Route 30. Sufficient advertising will be given for the show through magazines, newspapers, posters, and flyers. This is an outdoor sale. No Confirmation will be sent. No rain date or cancellation of show. Show goes on rain or shine.

Sales Contract Terms and Conditions

I/we agree to abide by the following terms as set forth:

1. Relieve the New Jersey Antique Bottle Club and the Batsto Village of responsibility for personal injury, damage, or loss of merchandise.
2. Sales material must consist of antique bottles, antiques, and related items, no new or flee market items please.
3. All material must be set up and priced for sale by 9:00am.
4. Reproductions must be identified if offered for sale.
5. Repaired material may be offered for sale if specifically noted.
6. Contracts under no condition may be sold or sublet without notifying the sponsor and no guarantee of spot. Spaces also cannot be ceded to someone else.
7. Each dealer is allowed one helper only.
8. No material may be removed prior to the 4:00pm closing except with the consent of the show chairman.
9. Show will close at 4:00pm and material must be out of the park prior to 5:30pm.
10. Dealers are responsible for furnishing their own chairs, tables & table covers. **All vendors must bring tables as they will not be supplied.**
11. **Dealers must wait to be assigned their table area. Anyone who proceeds to an unauthorized area will be fined, ticketed, & towed.- No Exceptions**

Dear Fellow Collectors,

March 21, 2009

The New Jersey Antique Bottle Club is now sponsoring three shows a year. The first show is held in South River in February. The second show is held in April in Millville. Our third show is the annual Batsto Village antique and bottle show held the last Sunday in September.

This year's Batsto show promises to be bigger and better than ever. The New Jersey Antique Bottle Club has contracted the Wheaton Arts Glass Blowers to blow glass outdoors at the show. This is the first time since the National Bottle Show in Cherry Hill in 1995 that glass will be blown at a bottle show. We have also contacted Revolutionary War re-enactment groups in an attempt to have them set up at the show. Unfortunately their schedules are already made for the year and getting a firm commitment from them at this time is difficult. However, we are still trying and maybe we will have a nice surprise on the day of the show.

Vendor space reservations remain on a first paid first reserved basis. Vendor spaces will not be held or reserved without payment for anyone under any circumstance. If you will be taking a table this year please keep in mind that you are on the grounds of Wharton State Forest which is operated by the New Jersey State Department of Environmental Protection. There are many more rules here than any other show our club is associated with. Let's take a moment to review some of these rules:

- 1) Parking – There will be no parking of vehicles anywhere on the property except for the designated grass parking area. That means no parking of vehicles behind the pile of bog iron, behind the bog iron sloop shed and anywhere along the road that runs alongside the mansion. If you are assigned a vendor space in this area, you will need to unload your table, chairs and sales stock and move your vehicle to the grass parking area. If you can not comply with this request, please write on your contract "Need space in Parking Area". You will be assigned a vendor space in the grass parking area where you will be allowed to keep your vehicle in your space. We don't have a problem with someone utilizing the back of a pick up truck, trailer or van as long as it is in the designated parking area. Please be advised that anyone parking a vehicle along either side of the mansion road will be ticketed, fined and towed. There will be no exceptions for the simple reason that parking outside of the designated parking area jeopardizes our chances of having a show at Batsto the following year.
- 2) Assigned Spaces – You will only be able to sell in your assigned vendor space. This is the space that matches our dealer list which is made up of the returned contracts. Spaces can not be ceded to, sublet or substituted by any one except the show chairman. If you have a conflict and can't make the show contact Paul and let him know of your intentions. This is very important because we are assigning vendor spaces according to the returned contract list.
- 3) Moving to Assigned Spaces – Last year half a dozen club members made effort to direct vendors to their assigned spaces. Although unsuccessful, we learned a lot. We have a new plan and we are confident that this year we will be able to guide you to your assigned space quickly. Please be patient with us and with your fellow vendors. It is in everyone's best interest to get set up in an orderly fashion. Please do not break out of the entry line and proceed to a space that is not yours. You will not be able to sell from that space and we will have the vehicle removed from the site at the owner's expense.

If you feel that you will not be able to comply with the above requirements please do not apply for a vendor space. If you can comply please join us, all are welcome.

It is certain that our expenses for this show will surpass the income we receive for vendor spaces. We don't view this as a losing proposition. We feel that it is money spent in an effort to promote our hobby.
