**Second Reading for next Sun., May 4, 2014**

**Third Sunday of Easter**

**Theme:** When we share meals, Christ sits among us.

**Breaking Open the Word :** Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Lk 24:13-35

*That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then*

*they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.*

**Step One: Listen to the Word**

What image in this familiar story touches your heart? What do you notice about the characters in this story?

**Step Two: Look into Your Life**

**Question for Children:** What is your favorite time to share a meal with your family?

**Question for Youth:** The disciples recognized Jesus in the breaking of bread. How have you experienced Jesus at Mass, in the breaking of the Eucharistic bread? How have you experienced Jesus at meals and with friends and family?

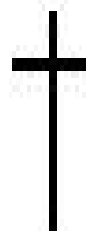
**Question for Adults:** Share about great meals you've been part of, ones which are still memorable to you.

### 2nd Sunday of Easter

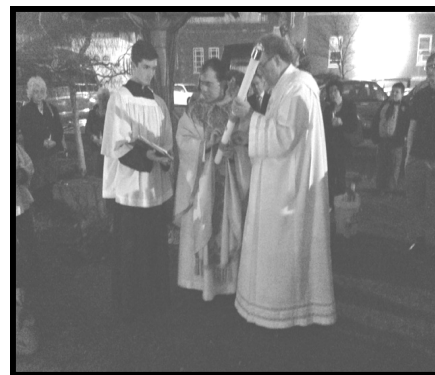
Happy Easter & Feliz Pascua everyone! Even though we have celebrated Easter Sunday beginning with the Easter Vigil on April 19th, we are still celebrating Easter because we now are in what is called the 50 days of Easter. The resurrection is such a momentous event that we need more than just a few days to unpack this Easter mystery. From the Saturday of the resurrection until Pentecost Sunday, June 8th, the Church is celebrating this time of joy and exultation as one feast day; as one Sunday. All this past week from Holy Saturday night April 19th thru Sunday April 27<sup>th</sup>, is known as the Octave of Easter where the Church unpacks the first stories of the resurrection. These are all days of solemn praise and worship of our risen Lord. During this Easter season, take the time to take some holy water home; you may call the priests to come and bless your home; read the book called the Acts of the Apostles from the Bible to see how the early Christian community grew after the Lord's resurrection; stop by the Easter candle and the cross and say a prayer and pray for all our First Holy Communicants who are preparing to receive the Lord Jesus for the first time. 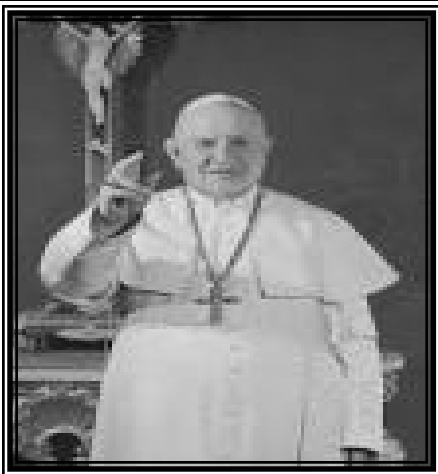

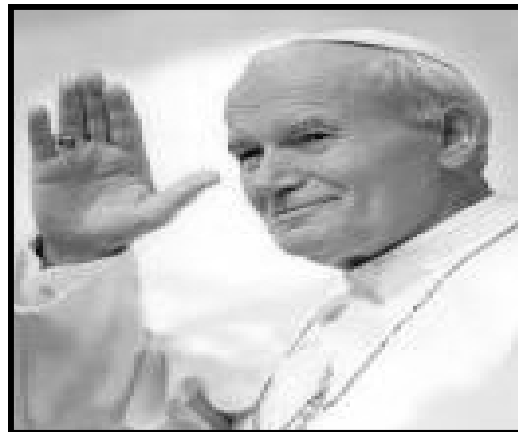
