Step One: Listen to the Word

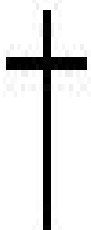
What words or phrases in today's reading touch your heart and mind? What feeling do you have after hearing the instructions of Peter?

Pastor's Corner

6th Sunday of Easter
Jesus Christ is Risen! Alleluia!
Jn 14:15-21

We might think that if we had been present when Jesus was around, life would have been easier. He would have explained everything to us, told us what to do and life would be better. However, we know that this would be further from the truth. Look at the disciples. They had Jesus around for three years. Yet, they denied him, did not always listen to him, ran away from him and even betrayed him. Many thought he was mad.

However, Jesus told them that even after he goes back to the Father, he would be with them forever in a new mode. This new mode is the Holy Spirit where the disciples will be able to do things they couldn't do while Jesus was physically around. The Holy Spirit is Jesus' own breath and his own life. When Jesus promises to send the Spirit he is promising to send us a helper. That means that the Holy Spirit will come to remind us of what Jesus had taught and strengthen us to live for God and be a witness to his love in the world. The Holy Spirit is also a Comforter. The spirit comes to lend support and a helping hand to help us cope with any disasters or tragedies that happen in our lives. The Holy Spirit comes not to take away a situation, but to help us get through it knowing we are not alone. Finally the Holy Spirit is our Advocate. The Spirit is like a lawyer representing us, most especially when we are put before a jury of critical opinion because of our goodness and our faith. God is constantly reminded of our plight because of the Holy Spirit who always pleads on our behalf.

Though it is difficult to believe, we Christians are in a better place than the disciples were because there are new possibilities open to us after the Lord's death and resurrection. Jesus now comes through the Spirit to us at any time and moment. He is no longer limited to space and time as he was in his earthly life. In order to allow Jesus to be effective in our lives, we need to pray in Jesus' name and live out his teachings in love. St. Irenaeus tells us that "love should be our life's mission because it is the engine of life".

One of the best examples of love has been shown by our soldiers who have given their lives for our country. Jesus said "No greater love than this than to lay down one's life for one's friends" Jn 15:13. 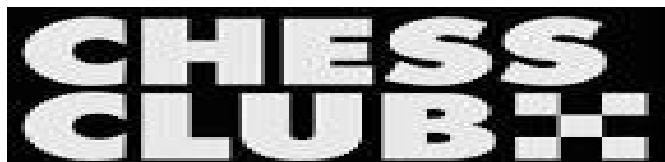
