Reading for next Sun., June 15 2014

The Most Holy Trinity

Theme: The mystery of the Trinity - Father, Son, Holy Spirit.

Breaking Open the Word-Suggested text for faith sharing: 2nd Reading Cor 13:11-13

Brothers and sisters, rejoice. Mend your ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss.

All the holy ones greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear this reading, what single line from St. Paul touches your heart? What is there in this reading that really speaks to your soul?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: When people love each other, how do they treat each other?

Question for Youth: The Trinity is celebrated today. How would you describe your relationship with God the Father? With Jesus? With the Spirit?

Question for Adults: If you were to encourage the members of your own parish to live as a "community of love," which is how we define the Trinity, how would you advise them to live? Use St. Paul's list of exhortations as your starting point.

Pastor's Corner

Pentecost The Conclusion of the Easter Season Jesus Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Jn 20:19-23

Happy Birthday everyone! Pentecost was originally a Jewish feast marking a time when the people would give gratitude to God for the first fruits of the harvest. Then it became a time when the Jewish people were celebrating the handing over of the Torah, the Law, from God to Moses and his people on Mt. Sinai. Jerusalem was very crowded during this time. Jewish people who spoke various languages were present. Pentecost for us, the Church, celebrates our birthday where the 11 apostles along with Mary, the mother of Jesus, were huddled in a dark upper room which was locked. While they were not sure what to do next after Jesus' ascension into Heaven, they sat and prayed as one community. Suddenly the Holy Spirit came upon them and filled them with fire of God's love that transformed their minds and hearts to preach and teach the Gospel to the "ends of the earth." When the apostles came and spoke to the people, they did so in various languages. The Church became a unity-in diversity atmosphere. On Pentecost Sunday, we conclude our 50 day celebration of Easter and our 90 day celebration of the Paschal Mystery (Jesus' Passion, Death, Resurrection, Ascension and the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost) that we began on Ash Wednesday. This day is the birthday of the Church where we gather at the Spirit's urging to praise and thank our loving God for all that has been given us in and through Christ Jesus. May we rejoice in the movement of the Holy Spirit, who is the ongoing presence of Jesus, and calls us to continue the work of Jesus and the church in our own lives today and always!

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

Let us pray.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen

The money that comes back to us will go for a new boiler (\$95,000) which we desperately need for next winter in our school buildings! Only 305 people have pledged so far. **We can do better in a parish of 2,500 households.** Since I have just made my pledge, I am asking each family or person to prayerfully give as well. No amount is too great or too small!

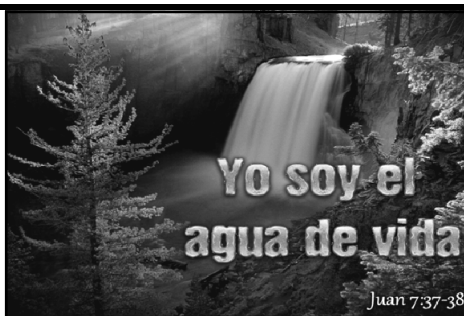

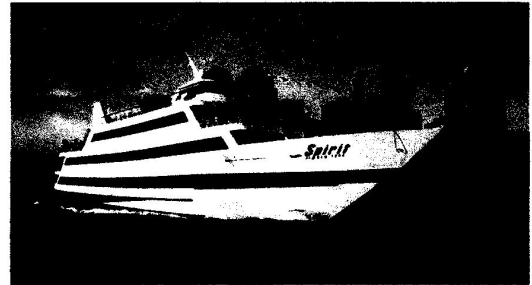
