Second Reading, from St. Paul 1 Cor 10:16-17

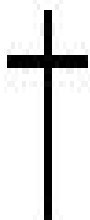

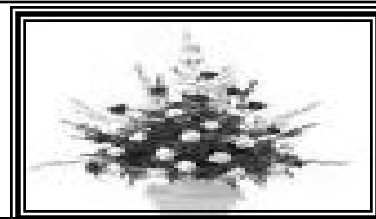

Pastor's Corner

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity Jn. 3:16-23

Trying to understand who God is and how God works is a mystery. There is no other day than when this mystery is best expressed than on this Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Church teaches us that the Holy Trinity is ONE GOD IN THREE PERSONS; FATHER, SON AND HOLY SPIRIT. What does this really mean for us? Saints and scholars have spent centuries trying to understand this concept. St. Augustine wrote a book on the Trinity known as “De Trinitate”. There is a legend about St. Augustine trying to grasp the Holy Trinity. It takes place on the seashore where he was walking along the beach clad in his Episcopal robes, pondering with difficulty the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity. “Father, Son, Holy Spirit; three in one!” he muttered, shaking his head. As he is walking and thinking, Augustine sees a little boy with a seashell running back and forth between the sea and a pool of water in the sand with a seashell of water. Augustine turned to the boy and asked him: “Son, what are you doing?” “Can’t you see?” said the boy. “I’m emptying the sea into this pool!” “Son, you can’t do that!” Augustine countered. “I will sooner empty the sea into this pool than you will manage to get the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity into your head!” Upon saying that, the boy, who was an angel according to legend, quickly disappeared, leaving Augustine alone with the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity.

The Holy Trinity is indeed a mystery. However, this does not mean that we should be intimidated or to think that the Trinity has nothing to do with our lives. The Holy Trinity, God as Father, Son and Spirit all relate to one another as a community where there is no division. We see this love expressed in our readings today where God’s love and mercy is for us despite our sinfulness. The God who heard the cries of his people in Egypt, witnessed their affliction and came down to save them (Ex 3:7-10) now sends his Son, the Word- made- flesh (Jn 1:14) so that “the world”, that is everyone who believes in him, will not be condemned but may be saved. Each of us is invited into this life of love where we are to live in union and communion with God and one another.

We are also called to be living examples of the Holy Trinity in our relationships each day. The Holy Trinity shows us that it is not self-contained, egotistical and self-absorbed but overflowing love, out-reaching desire for union with all that God has made. We are to live our lives as the Father, Son and Spirit relate to each other. When we live lives of love, we live the Trinity. When we foster division in our parish, families, work, school and our relationships, we choose to stand in evil and we push God away. May we pray for the grace to live our lives in communion with one another so that the Holy Trinity will shine in us forever.

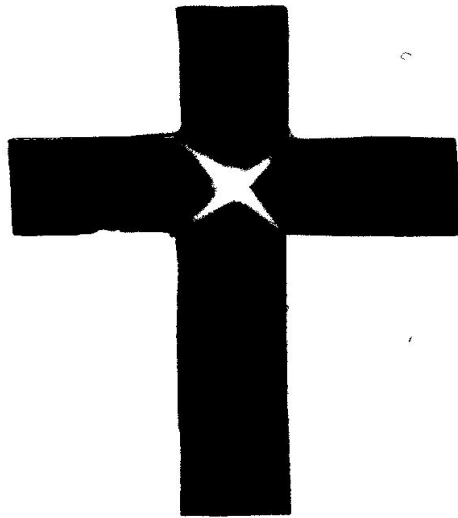
