No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

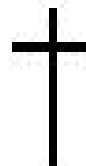

**SACRIFICIAL GIVING**

These past few weeks we have been listening to the parables of Jesus concerning the Kingdom of God. Parables are stories or tools of teaching that Jesus used which have an unexpected outcome. They capture the listener's attention. Today Jesus captures our hearing by comparing the Kingdom of Heaven to discovering a buried treasure and a pearl of great price. He is telling us that the Kingdom of Heaven is so important that it is beyond any value of material wealth we find on earth. Since the Kingdom of Heaven is so valuable to us, we are not only to discover the Kingdom but to share it with others. This will bring us a joy that will lead us into the Kingdom of Heaven forever.

The question is what do we think the Kingdom of Heaven is like and how important is the Kingdom to us? This past week, I witnessed the Kingdom of Heaven at the Hicksville Fair when many of you stopped by to say hello and some of you even volunteered to help spread the Gospel. I also experienced the Kingdom of Heaven in the celebration of one of our maintenance men, Randy Joseph, who after 16 years of dedicated work for St. Ignatius, has retired. This has all been climaxed by our celebration of the liturgy each Sunday and everyday reminding us of how to live in the Kingdom.

There are places however, where the Kingdom of Heaven is difficult to find, most especially in the Middle East and the Ukraine. I recently read a letter from the Catholic Patriarch of Babylon for the Chaldean, Louis Raphael Sako. He oversees the Chaldean Catholic Church in Iraq. The following is a section from his letter to the world. **"PEACE AND MERCY FROM GOD!" "The control exercised by the Islamist Jihadists upon the city of Mosul, and their proclamation of it as an Islamic State, after several days of calm and expectant watching of events, has now come to reflect negatively upon the Christian population of the city and its environs. The initial sign was in the kidnapping of the two nuns and 3 orphans who were released after 17 days. At the time, we experienced it as a flash of hope and as a clearing of the sky after the appearance of storm clouds. Suddenly, we have been surprised by the more recent outcomes which are the proclamation of an Islamic state and the announcement calling all Christians and clearly asking them to convert to Islam or to pay the jizyah (the tax all non-Muslims must pay while living in the land of Islam) – without specifying the exact amount. The only alternative is to abandon the city and their houses with only the clothes they are wearing, taking nothing else. Moreover, by Islamic law, upon their departure, their houses are no longer their properties but are instantly confiscated as property of the Islamic state. In recent days, there has been written the letter 'N' in Arabic on the front wall of Christian homes, signifying 'Nazara' (Christian), and on the front wall of Shiite homes, the letter 'R' signifying 'Rwafidh' (Protestants or rejecters). We do not know what will happen in future days because in an Islamic state the Al-sharia or Islamic code of law is powerful and has been interpreted to require the issuance of new I.Ds for the population based on religious or sectarian affiliation. He reminds all Christians what the Kingdom of Heaven should be like when he tells them to "understand what is planned for this region, to practice solidarity in love, to examine the realities together and so be able together to find the paths to build trust in themselves and in their neighbors. Let them stay close to their own Church and surround it; endure the time of trial and pray until the storm will be over".**

Many of us may take this treasure of the Kingdom of Heaven for granted because of the freedoms that we have in our country. We may even let our guard and enthusiasm down. May the words of Patriarch Sako remind us that the Kingdom of Heaven is a gift that requires a life of sacrifice, commitment and love. May we pray that God's Kingdom one day becomes a reality for all.

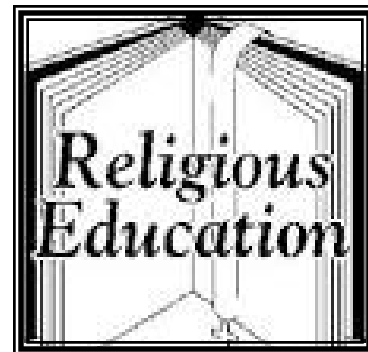

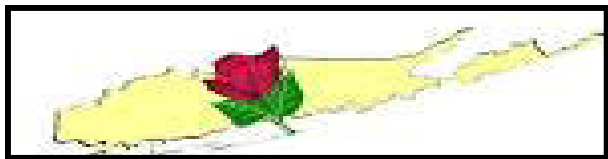
