Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: 1st Reading, from Kings 19:9a, 11-13a

At the mountain of God, Horeb, Elijah came to a cave where he took shelter. Then the LORD said to him, "Go outside and stand on the mountain before the LORD; the LORD will be passing by." A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountains and crushing rocks before the LORD—but the LORD was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake—but the LORD was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake there was fire—but the LORD was not in the fire. After the fire there was a tiny whispering sound. When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children:

What does God's voice sound like when you pray and listen to Jesus?

Pastor's Corner

18 Sunday in Ordinary Time
Mt. 14:31-21

THE HOMEBOUND

How many of us have someone who is sick at home or elderly or know of someone like this and they cannot get to Church? It is important that your priests know who are the homebound in our parish. Jesus' main ministry was to heal the sick and the broken hearted. In today's Gospel, we see how he shared himself in the loaves and the fishes. We are called to do the same with the Eucharist and our lives. We have Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (Formerly known as EM's) who go weekly or monthly to visit the homebound to make sure they are connected to the parish. The original purpose of the tabernacle is to house the Eucharist from Sunday Mass for the sick. We are to give them the Eucharist from Mass to keep them connected to the Mass.

If your loved one(s), friends or neighbors are home and cannot get to church, please contact the rectory. The priest will come first with Holy Communion and the oil of the Anointing of the Sick. He will also hear confessions. So often I hear of families who are burying their loved ones unaware that they could have received Holy Communion and the Sacraments of Healing (Reconciliation & Anointing of the Sick) to help them in their critical time of life. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for anyone who is seriously or chronically ill to bring them healing and strength. It is not just for those waiting to die. If your loved one is near death, please contact the rectory immediately so that they can be anointed and receive viaticum (Holy Communion-Food for the soul before death) to help prepare their soul for death and go to God. Please don't wait till it is too late!

THE BLESSED SACRAMENT CHAPEL

Every day the Blessed Sacrament Chapel is open at St. Ignatius Loyola Church from 7am till 3pm. This allows us the opportunity for prayer and adoration to Jesus present in the Holy Eucharist. During this period, we have Exposition of the Eucharist (Host in a Monstrance) which takes place after the 9am Mass unless there are funerals. Exposition occurs after the funerals, since Christ is made present on the main altar of the church during the Mass. The Church teaches that at least 2 people should be present during the hours of exposition. However, as long as one person is present at all times, we are meeting minimum requirements. **There have been numerous occasions during exposition where no one has been in the chapel. This concerns me greatly.** Christ cannot be left alone, because His presence is for people like us not an empty space.

I write to encourage each of us to do our best to make time to be in the chapel. This is a real treasure we have here at St. Ignatius Loyola begun by Msgr. Bennett. The Eucharist shows us that Christ loves us without limit. For those who desire to have this gift remain, can you not spend a few minutes before the Lord who gave His very life? You certainly will not regret it! We may have to find an alternative way of adoration, such as a sign-in book, if the chapel remains empty. If you have any suggestions, please contact me at the rectory.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND OUR FACILITIES

To help keep you informed about the parish plant, you will see this column on an occasional basis of "what's happening around our facilities". Modifications have been made in the former "new school" building by Vocational Education and Extension Board (VEEB) School of Practical Nursing. They are preparing for their LPN classes beginning in September, 2014. Stay tune for more information, including an Open House to welcome the LPN School to St. Ignatius Loyola.

We had to fill in parts of the parking lot due to a weakness in the ground. Hopefully all shall remain stable. You may have noticed that the maintenance shed was taken apart. The roof collapsed because of the weight from all the winter snows. One of our boy scouts is planning on building us a new shed for his Eagle Scout project. I am grateful that the Scouts are here to help us with the many projects that are necessary to complete here at St. Ignatius. Please continue to enjoy the Summer in August! Time is fleeting. 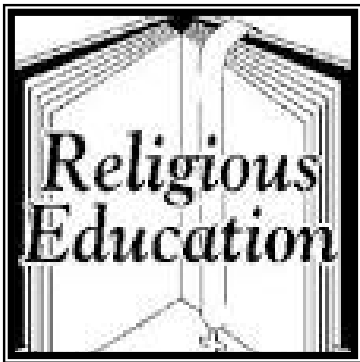

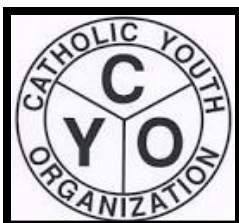

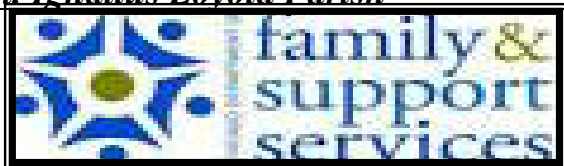
