Breaking Open the Word Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Mt. 15:21-28

At that time, Jesus withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And behold, a Canaanite woman of that district came and called out, "Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David! My daughter is tormented by a demon." But Jesus did not say a word in answer to her. Jesus' disciples came and asked him, "Send her away, for she keeps calling out after us." He said in reply, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." But the woman came and did Jesus homage, saying, "Lord, help me." He said in reply, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." She said, "Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters." Then Jesus said to her in reply, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." And the woman's daughter was healed from that hour.

Step One: Listen to the Word

What in this story strikes you as powerful? What touches your heart? What image do you take away from this reading?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: What is your favorite way to talk with Jesus? What words do you use?

Question for Youth: Do you trust that God hears your prayers? Do you believe that your prayer makes a difference?

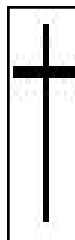
Question for Adults: When you pray, how do you know that Jesus will really respond?

Pastor's Corner

August 10, 2014
19th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Mt. 14:22-33

During the Summer, St. Ignatius Loyola has traditionally closed its buildings, except for the church and rectory so that our maintenance staff can clean, paint and wash down the rooms that have been used each and every day of the year. **This year our buildings will be closed to all meetings beginning Wednesday, August 13, 2014. The buildings will reopen Tuesday, September 2, 2014.** Even buildings and rooms need a break just like people, so that we can prepare for the upcoming Parish year which traditionally begins again in September. We will have an outside cleaning service assist Tony and our staff in cleaning out the dust and the cobwebs that like to accumulate during the year.

I ask each of our ministries to abide by this policy and take the time to reflect over the past year and what will happen in your ministry over the coming year. The Summer is an excellent time to think about our vision and ask ourselves, how are we doing? How is our membership? How can we invite more people to participate in our ministry and in our parish? How can we deepen our spirituality in Jesus Christ and learn more about His Church? Does our ministry fit in with our parish Mission Statement? If so, how? If not, what do we need to do? Is our ministry and its work what God wants or what I want?

St. Therese of Lisieux gives us a great quote that we can pray over for the rest of the summer and throughout the year: "Jesus, help me to simplify my life by learning what you want me to be and becoming that person". Jesus what are you asking of me (us) now?"

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that we are always to keep our focus on Jesus. Once we start focusing only on material goods, our worries, fears, desires, and the enthrallment /business of other people, then we like Peter begin to sink in life. What is great about our faith is that Jesus is always there to pick us right back up! We need to cooperate.

This will be my last bulletin article for a while as I will be on vacation beginning August 13th. Vacations and breaks are important, because they help to refresh and renew us for the work to come. St. John Paul II once wrote "Holidays and vacations can help to balance activity with contemplation, haste with more natural rhythms, noise with the heralding silence of peace".
