"Belong More Deeply"

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time
Reading for next Sun., August 31, 2014

Theme: The cross is a way that leads to true life.

Breaking Open the Word-Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Mt 16:21-27

Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised. Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? Or what can one give in exchange for his life? For the Son of Man will come with his angels in his Father's glory, and then he will repay all according to his conduct."

Step One: Listen to the Word-When you hear the Gospel proclaimed today, what words or phrases really strike you? What lingers in your memory from this reading?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Jesus tells us that we each are called to follow him. What is hard for you to do to follow Jesus?

Question for Youth: In order to follow Jesus, we have to do hard things, to carry our own crosses. What is a cross that you are carrying right now? In what ways can you ask Jesus to help you with your cross?

Question for Adults: Jesus gives us the core truth to life and eternal happiness — the cross. Name the cross that you carry. How is it bringing you closer to God?

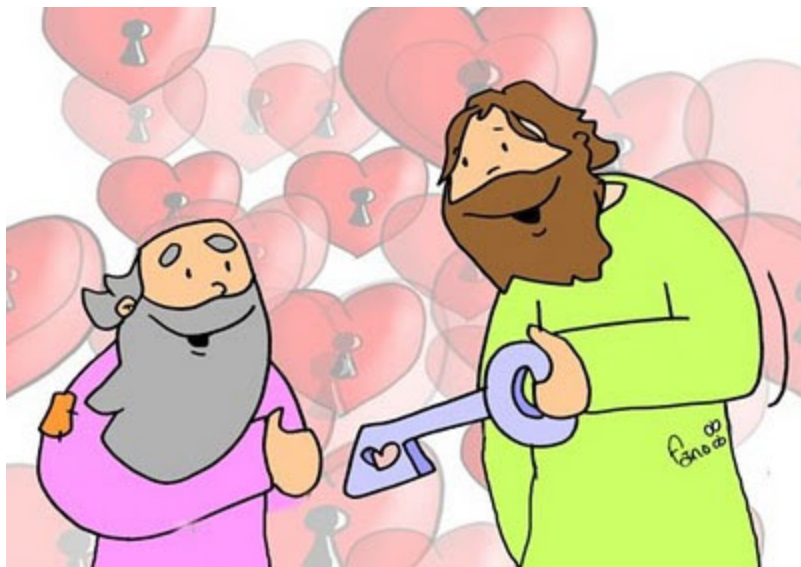


My hope is that you are having a safe and restful summer. May it be a time for you to find the Lord by taking time out from the business of life. It is hard to believe that we are coming upon our annual parish picnic to be held on Saturday September 6, 2014. This is an exciting time for us as a parish to celebrate our heritage, culture and our faith. It is a time where we can come together as family especially for one last "fling" of the summer. Please join us!

Every year, we conduct a SPECIAL FRIENDS Campaign that had been a major source of revenue for our school. Now this campaign will serve as a major source of financial help for the parish. The funds raised by this campaign will be used exclusively for the benefit of the parish to help us thrive in the many programs we offer and to help cover the costs of maintaining parish operations. Even though we are still in summer, fall and winter are coming upon us. It will be cold once again. This year we are putting in a new burner to service both the new and old school buildings which will benefit our Religious Education program, other parish activities, plus our nursing school. This burner will cost approximately \$54,000. Your support is greatly needed.

The drawing will be held at the annual Parish Picnic on Saturday, September 6, 2014 (immediately following the 5pm Mass) with five (5) cash prizes awarded that day: \$3,000 \$2,000, \$1,000 and two (2) \$250. Winners need not be present to win and will be notified.
