**Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Reading**  
**for next Sun., Sept. 21, 2014**

**Theme:** It is never too late to enter the reign of God.

**Breaking Open the Word:** Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Mt 20:1-16a

*Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."*

**Step One: Listen to the Word-**As you listen once again to this familiar parable, what caught your ear in it today? What image of this vineyard do you still have lingering in your mind?

**Step Two: Look into Your Life**

**Question for Children:** How do you experience God being generous to you: through your family, friends, school, or parish?

**Question for Youth:** This Gospel reminds us that God is always seeking us out and welcoming us into his generous love. Through whom has God reached out to you? Who is always encouraging you to say "yes" to God?

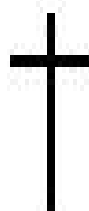
**Question for Adults:** Using Jesus' parable as your starting point, describe in your own words how God will treat those who come to be part of the church, even those who come late.

# Pastor's Corner

September 14, 2014  
Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross  
Jn 3:13-17

Greetings to everyone! I pray that you had a safe and relaxing summer as it could possibly be. It is hard to believe that the unofficial summer has come and gone. When you come by during the week, you may notice many cars in our back parking lot. A School for Nursing (LPN) has been established since the summer months in the "new school". I am grateful to Agnes Quinn and the people of VEEB (Vocational Education and Extension Board) for having confidence in us in using our facilities for such a great cause. More to come.

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the **Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross**. This feast lands on a Sunday once every 7 years. It was on this day September 14, 335 that a relic of the TRUE CROSS discovered by St. Helena was exalted, lifted up for veneration of the assembled faithful at the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, the place where Christ rose from the dead. As we focus on the cross of Jesus, we focus on our own crosses of life. Each of us, believer and non-believer, has a cross to bear of some kind of suffering no matter who we are in life. We experienced it as a nation on 9/11/2001. However, what makes ours so special is that we can unite our crosses of life to the one cross of Jesus and know that we are not alone in our sufferings and problems. When Jesus died on the cross, He had you and me in mind. He assumed everything in our humanity and redeemed it. At my alma mater of King's College in Wilkes-Barre, PA., there is a cross that looks like an anchor in one of the courtyards. Below it are the words "**The Cross, Our Only Hope.**" Just like they found a cross made of two beams that survived World Trade Center calamity, the cross of Christ is there for us in our lives too. May we continue to hold on to the cross of Christ which is our only hope that saves us from the evils and death in this life and raises us up to an eternal life to come.

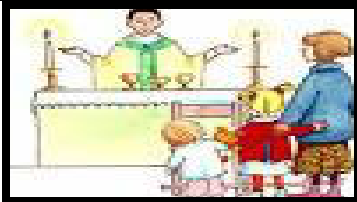

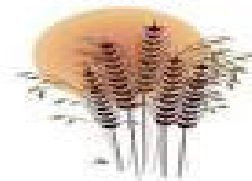
