Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading for next Sun., Sept. 28, 2014

Theme: It's not enough to merely say you believe. You must also live your faith.

Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Mt. 21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: "What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He came to the first and said, 'Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.' He said in reply, 'I will not, 'but afterwards changed his mind and went. The man came to the other son and gave the same order. He said in reply, 'Yes, sir, 'but did not go. Which of the two did his father's will?" They answered, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him."

Step One: Listen to the Word: When you hear the story of the two sons, what about it touches your heart? What image lingers in your memory from this reading?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: How do you show your love for Jesus by doing what he asks, even when it is difficult for you?

Question for Youth: Today's parable reminds us that it isn't what we say that counts as much as what we do. How would someone know you are a Christian through your actions?

Question for Adults: How and when were you like each of the sons in the Gospel?

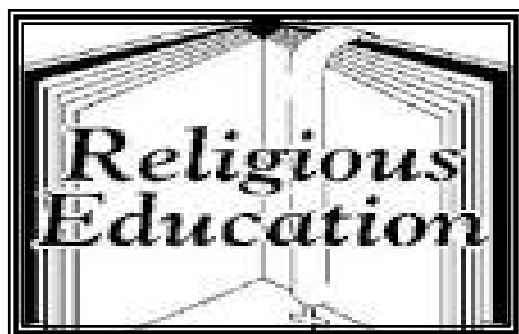

Pastor's Corner

September 21, 2014
25th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Mt. 20:1-16a

It's not fair!" This is an expression that I said often as a child when I felt my brothers got away with more than I could ever imagine. I am sure many of us feel this way when we perceive that we are receiving the short end of the stick especially in families large and small. Let's face it, some things in life are not fair.. But, we don't have to fall as victims to it and always worrying about losing out. In my family, I later came to understand that my parents loved me equally just as they did my older brothers, John and Michael. We did not have to do anything to prove their love for us because we were very much a part of their lives. We also grew up in different circumstances where my parents had to make appropriate measures where they saw fit.

In today's Gospel of Matthew, Jesus is teaching us in another parable that God's generosity is extended to all. However, we may feel cheated like those laborers who came in first and received the same pay as those who entered last. We may feel this way about lapsed Catholics, non-believers or notorious sinners who often get away from everything. Those first laborers in the parable are last because they shifted their focus from doing the work for the landowner to grumbling about the amount of wages others are receiving. The ones who are first do not labor in the vineyard because of the amount of wages, but simply because they are privileged to share in the work of the landowner. They aren't worried about what others are doing, just their task at hand. Simply being called to the privilege of sharing in Jesus' work of salvation is its own reward. The kingdom of heaven is revealed by those who choose this work. They can be people like you and me, the person who may not have gone to Church for many years and reached out to the Lord in forgiveness at the 11th hour, the person who's on welfare looking for an opportunity and the person coming from another country looking for hope. St. Augustine once said, "God loves each of us as if there were only one of us." If only we could live this out every day without judging the heart of others, and allowing God to do His work, our world would be a much better place. This Gospel is about God's generosity. If we want God to be generous with us may we pray to be generous with one another.

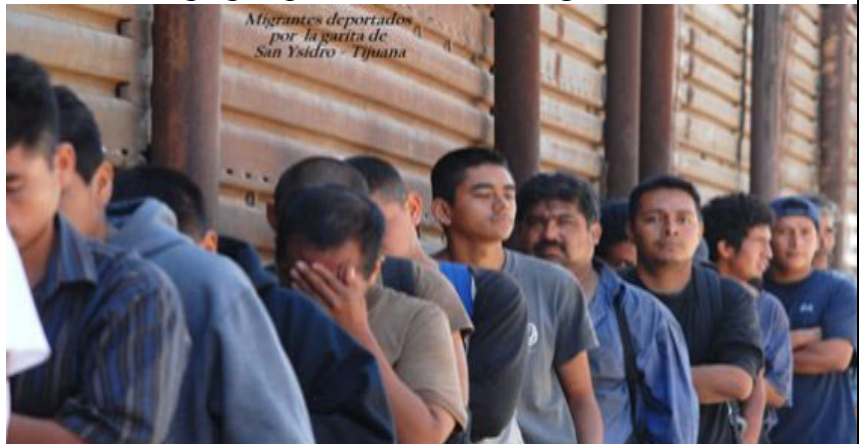

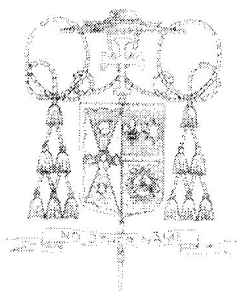

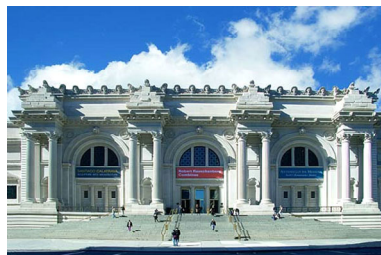
