Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time
Reading for next Sun., October 5, 2014

Theme: Whatever is good and true, think about these things.

Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith sharing: 2nd Reading, Paul to the Philippians

Brothers and sisters: Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you.

Step One: Listen to the Word: As you hear the word proclaimed today, what admonition of Paul's catches your ear? What line of this reading touches your heart?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: What makes you feel peaceful inside? What makes you feel restless?

Question for Youth: How do you thank God for the talents that you have? How do you give back to God through the use of your talent?

Question for Adults: What steps do you take each week to make sure you are doing as Paul directs: "Live according to what you have learned and accepted."?

Pastor's Corner

September 28, 2014
26th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Mt. 21:28-32

This Sunday we continue to hear what the Kingdom of God is really like. This parable by Jesus is another one that can cause some discomfort depending on how we live our Christian life. Jesus tells the chief priests and elders that “tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the Kingdom of God before you”. Today we would compare that to Jesus saying to us that politicians, drug dealers, cheaters, those who don’t go to Mass on Saturday night or Sunday, are getting into Heaven before us. How startling is that? Jesus is making a point about complacency. Often we think that just because we are baptized, we go to Mass on Saturday night and Sundays and we are involved in our parish, that is our ticket to Heaven. It is part of it, but not the whole thing. We may feel that we are entitled to Heaven. Simply said, none of us are entitled to Heaven. It is a gift unmerited given to us by God.

One statement I heard while studying the Sacraments, was Christians are made and not born. Meaning that we grow into being a Catholic Christian day by day from the moment we are baptized. I always inform parents preparing for their children’s baptism, to remind them of their responsibility in preparing them to live the Christian life. The Christian life does not stop at baptism. Recently, I heard a disheartening story of a man who left the Catholic Church because he could not stand the other Catholics who go to Sunday and daily mass gossiping and bashing others at work. He became so discouraged that he just stopped going to Church. Is this the parish and community we want?

Each day, our attitude, St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Philippians, must be that of Jesus Christ. This means we need to surrender our lives each day and have a soul always willing to change for the Lord. Instead of judging the hearts of others, we need to look at ourselves in the eyes of God. In the end, God who is not only fair but Fairness itself, does not impose judgment, but respecting our Freedom lets us judge ourselves, then lets our judgments stand. May we say yes to our Lord with our thoughts, words and actions now and not wait before it’s too late.

We at St. Ignatius will honor life with a variety of scheduled events. 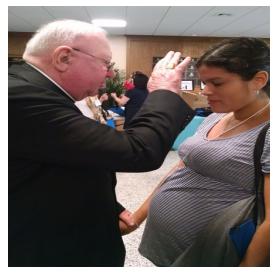

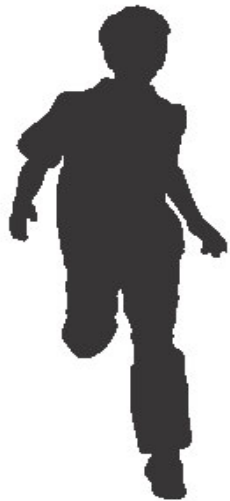
