**Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**Reading for next Sun., October 12, 2014**

**Theme:** Only those who enter the banquet will share the reign of God.

**Breaking Open the Word:** Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel, the short version Mt 22-10

*Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."' Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests."*

**Step Two: Look into Your Life**

**Question for Children:** Why is it important for you to do what Jesus asks of you?

**Question for Youth:** Each week we are invited to participate in Mass. When you are at Mass, how well do you really participate? How could you be more present in heart, mind, and spirit?

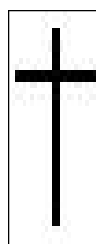
**Question for Adults:** Using Jesus' parable as your starting point, describe in your own words who will be welcome and why they will be welcome, at the eternal banquet of God.

# Pastor's Corner

October 5, 2014  
27<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time  
Mt. 21:33-43

One sad event that happens too often in America is when family owned businesses/ establishments close down. Once the owners of a business who are the parents/grandparents hand it on to their children and/or grandchildren, the establishment falls apart. This may have happened through no one's fault. However, it has happened where family members are no longer interested, they may have gotten too greedy or they have lost the work ethic that their parents and grandparents had in the past. Since the establishment is not taken care of properly, it has to shut down. What was once a lively place, is now inundated with overgrown weeds and the building falling apart. This happened with a family home down our block. Once the grandparents had died, the children did not care for the property and it looks like an eye sore.

In today's parable of the owner of a vineyard and his tenants, Jesus tells the leaders of Israel that they were given the responsibility of taking care of the Lord's vineyard by taking care of His people. Since they failed, their gift would be taken away from them and given to those who fully trust in the Lord and perform his merciful deeds. Each of us are responsible for the world in which we live. We are co-creators with our God to help ensure all that we are given is treated with care and respect. The world, our Church, our parish, and our homes are our vineyards. We need to ensure that our children and our grandchildren are taught a faith that helps to build a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and one another. If we do not take this responsibility seriously, it may one day be taken away from us.

One area that we need to take very seriously is our responsibility to care for life from the moment of natural conception to natural death. This begins by taking care of the unborn human being found in a mother's womb. Our society today is very disposable. We often treat the unborn as a commodity. If an unborn child is a nuisance or inconvenient, society says to get rid of it through an abortion. This is not what we are about as Catholics, let alone fellow human beings.

Violence in the womb opens us to a violent world. Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said **"We must not be surprised when we hear of murders, of killings, of wars, of hatred. If a mother can kill her own child, what is left but for us to kill each other."** Join us in a pro-life movement which only requires our stand for the sanctity of all human life, most especially the unborn. Pray for mothers who have had an abortion or are considering an abortion. Human life is our vineyard that the Lord has given us. Let us not be like those tenants who lose it because of our negligence. We shall one day be held accountable for what we do and fail to do.

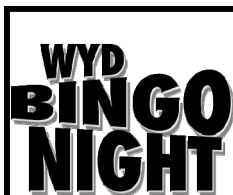
