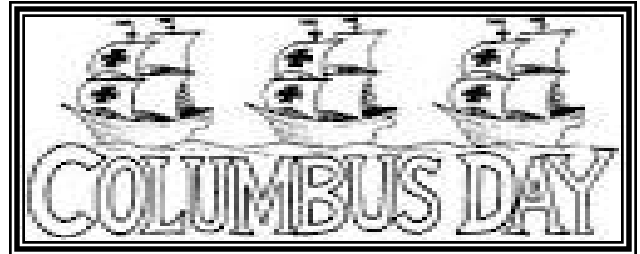

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: 2nd Reading from St. Paul

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy to the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: grace to you and peace. We give thanks to God always for all of you, remembering you in our prayers, unceasingly calling to mind your work of faith and labor of love and endurance in hope of our Lord Jesus Christ, before our God and Father, knowing, brothers and sisters loved by God, how you were chosen. For our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction.

Step One: Listen to the Word

Hearing this lovely opening to Paul's letter to the Church in Thessalonica, what part of it touches your heart? What single word catches your ear?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: In your young life, who has helped you know Jesus as a friend?

Question for Youth: We are supposed to give to God the things that are God's. What in your life is dedicated to God? How do you keep those things sacred?

Question for Adults: If you were to write a thank you note to someone or to a group who has helped you grow in faith, to whom would you write and what would you say?

Pastor's Corner

October 12, 2014
28th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Mt. 22:1-14

If you have ever traveled on a cruise, you know that there are usually two formal nights where a person is invited to join the Captain's Dinner. They may choose a regular dining room or the formal dinner. If they go, they need to wear formal clothing. If they walk in without the particular clothing, they will be asked to leave and come back. Hats and caps are definitely not permitted. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us of yet another parable of the Kingdom of Heaven where the King invites all people to a wedding banquet. However, the regular guests refuse to come. Some completely ignore the King's request and resort to violence. This does not stop the King, however. He has his subjects go out to invite the downcasts, outcasts, the poor and the sinners to his table bypassing the privileged. He invites them until the banquet room has an infinite capacity. We see however, that even though all are able to join, some are thrown out because they did not wear the proper garment.

This parable tells us how God relates to us and our relationship to God and one another. God continually invites us into His life each and every day. A yes was said for us or we said yes at our Baptism when the white garment was placed upon us. However, just because we were invited in does not automatically guarantee our stay in the Kingdom of Heaven. If we want to stay in God's Kingdom, we need to ensure that our baptismal garment is worn everyday in a spiritual way. We are to live out our baptism by taking on the responsibility of being a disciple of Jesus. The only requirement for the banquet is to willingly and gratefully receive what the King has to offer. This means we are to be contrite for our faults and act toward each other the way God acts toward us. We are not here to judge the hearts of others, but to welcome them into our lives and our parish the way God welcomes us. Today's reading from Isaiah, the Psalm and the parable remind us that God is waiting on us as the banquet provider and the one who is always offering us grace and a joyous feast. As we journey through fall with our minds toward the Thanksgiving Feast, may we make the kingdom feast our priority and be willing to participate together (Anglo, Hispanic, Asian alike) with all those invited.

Speaking of feasts, join us today (**Sunday Oct. 12**) for **Día De La Raza, the Day of the Race**, sponsored by the Spanish speaking members of our parish. This event will be held from **2pm to 6pm in the Cafeteria (Old School)**. This is a time when all the countries of Latin America get together annually to celebrate the time when Christopher Columbus landed on the Bahamas Islands. Even though Columbus was not the first to discover America, he was the one to bring about the first real contact and interaction between Renaissance Europe and the American continent with its various civilizations; and that has shaped and changed world history in countless ways. FYI; Columbus Day is Monday Oct. 13th where all offices and activities in the parish are closed. .

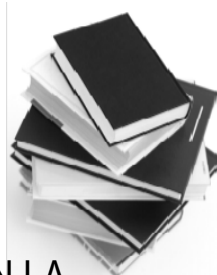

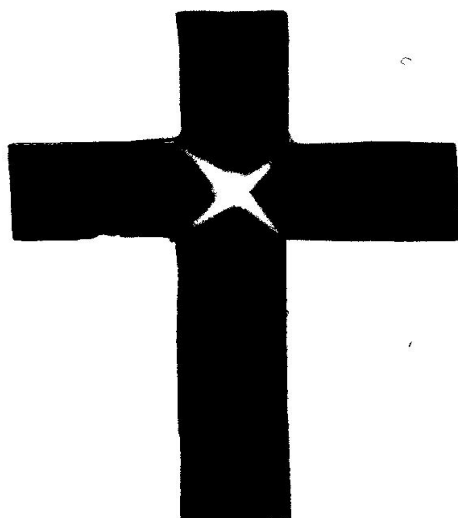
