Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Theme: Christ calls us to use our gifts for the Reign of God.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel- the short version Mt 25:14-30

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "A man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one-- to each according to his ability. Then he went away. Immediately the one who received five talents went and traded with them, and made another five. Likewise, the one who received two made another two. But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money.

After a long time the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them. The one who had received five talents came forward bringing the additional five. He said, 'Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.'

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you listen once again to this familiar parable, what caught your ear in it today? What image or action from the reading lingers in your memory now?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Name one talent or gift that God has given you and tell how you have used it.

Question for Youth: Name three talents that you have. How can you use these talents in the next week to make someone's life better?

Question for Adults: Using Jesus' parable as your starting point, describe in your own words how you are using your own gifts to enrich the reign of God.

Pastor's Corner

November 9, 2014
Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran
32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time
John 2:13-22

Today the Church celebrates the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran which is the Pope's Church in Rome, as the Bishop of the Diocese of Rome. On the Church building of St. John Lateran, is inscribed, "Mother and Head of All Churches of the City and of the world." This inscription proclaims the Lateran Basilica as the pre-eminent or the first Cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope. Our communion, our unity in faith, as the Diocese of Rockville Centre and the parish of St. Ignatius Loyola, with the Church of Rome and the worldwide Catholic Church, prompts us to celebrate the dedication anniversary of St. John Lateran in every Roman Catholic place of worship throughout the world, from the grandest cathedral to the remotest mission.

As we reflect on this special anniversary of the Cathedral of Rome, we also reflect on the nature of the Church. What does it mean to be church? We are more than just mortar, bricks and stone. Each of us by our Baptism, make up the church of God. As church, we are God's instrument in every corner of the world, and our baptismal image is to become more and more "the temple of God" as we hear from the Prophet Ezekiel. We are living temples because Jesus is God's temple raising the baptized into his death. While we honor our churches as sacred spaces of worship, we must remember that the living Church, people like you and me who are the holy people of God, called to bring His Word to all people of the world. The Gospel challenges us to purify our lives as God's temple from the clutter of the world whether that be profit, gain, fear, addiction, insecurity, excessive pride and gluttony.

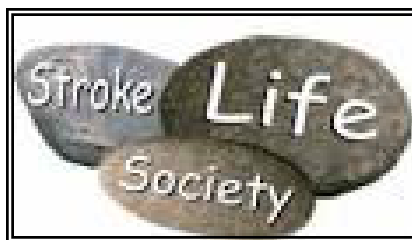
