Theme: God calls us to follow Christ.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Jn 1:35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah", which is translated Christ. Then he brought him to Jesus, Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas"—which is translated Peter.

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear this familiar story of Jesus calling his first disciples, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: What can you do this week to show that you are a follower of Jesus?

Question for Youth: Andrew seemed to know immediately that he should follow Jesus. Do you have that same sense of confidence in your faith in Jesus? What helps? What makes it hard?

Question for Adults: In what ways do you experience being called by Jesus? What does he want you to do?

Pastor's Corner

Christmas Season
Baptism of the Lord
Mk 1:7-11

To All My Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

As we begin the second week of the New Year, it is important to write to you about the State of our Parish of St. Ignatius Loyola, both Spiritual and Financial. Both pieces go hand in hand in helping to make a parish flourish. This week's bulletin contains this past year's (September 2013-August 2014) Sacramental and Financial Report. I thank those parishioners who give so generously of themselves to prepare our young people as well as adults for the sacraments, who serve in our liturgical ministries, our Ministry of Consolation and the many other ministries that support our parish's sacramental life. I thank those parishioners who have participated in the weekly Sunday Masses thanking God for your week. I am most grateful to the 2014 Parish Finance Committee for their diligence in overseeing the use of our parish's resources. They are John Riegert-Chairperson, Robert Howard-, Peggy Gill, Joe Pannarelli, Carol Hogan, Mike Krummenacker, Mary Ann Lang and Linda Price our Parish Accountant. Some of our committee members have completed their terms, so I thank them for their years of service.

Thank you to all who contributed to our parish. Your financial support is vital to the continuation of the good work we do here at St. Ignatius Loyola. I invite you to contact me, should you have any questions regarding the enclosed statement. For the last several years we were able to meet our expenses and deal with some larger projects. However, this will become increasingly difficult as the subsidy to support Catholic education has gone into effect, while struggling with increases in aging structures. This makes it an even more daunting challenge to pay down our accumulated debt (2,411,389), to set aside funds for larger projects (such as a new organ, paying for our new boilers, repairs to the sacristy roof) and to invest in the ministries which are so essential to the heart and soul of our parish.

We are so grateful for the opportunity to have the Vocational Education and Extension Board (VEEB) of Nassau County use the "new" school building for their administration and to conduct a practical nursing program (LPN). The rental fees serve to defray the cost of maintaining the building.

Thank you for expressing your love for our parish in so many ways. I humbly ask that you reflect on how essential the presence of St. Ignatius Loyola Parish is in your life and the lives of generations to come and ---if at all possible---increase your gift so that we might continue our mission to all of God's people here in Hicksville. We are the Mother Church. But we cannot maintain her without all of our help and support. Please know of my gratitude for everyone who has given of their time, talent and treasure for the good work of our parish. So many lives have been touched by the work, support and prayers and fellow parishioners. On this **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**, may we continue to work together to make God's love present in our midst. That is what our Baptism calls us to do.

May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

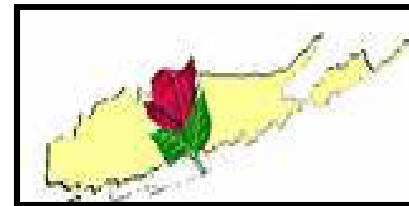

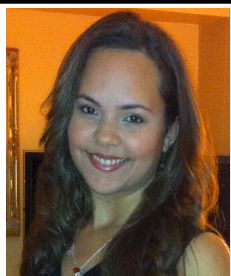
