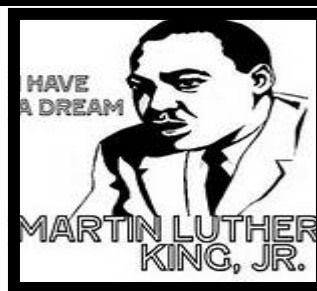

Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Mk1:14-20

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." As he passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Then they abandoned their nets and followed him. He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets. Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him.

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear Jesus calling others to be fishers of people, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: What do you think it was like for the people in today's Gospel to be called by Jesus? What did they have to give up in order to follow him?

Question for Youth: At the start of Jesus' ministry, Jesus invites people to "believe in the Good News." What are some ways that you could be more open to the truth and challenge contained within the Gospels?

Question for Adults: If someone asked you, "To what work has Jesus called you?" how would you answer?

Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ of St. Ignatius Loyola,
Since 2002, the Catholic Church has been at the forefront to do all they can to insure the safety and protection of children and young people. This involves the cooperation of all Catholic Parishes in the United States, including our own.

Diocese of Rockville Centre Protecting God's Children (Virtus)

The Diocesan Child Protection Policy continues to emphasize concern for children and compliance with all provisions contained in the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People and the essential Norms for Diocesan/Eparchial Policies Dealing with Allegations of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priest or Deacons (The Dallas Charter) approved by US Catholic bishops in November 2002.

The Diocese of Rockville Centre is committed to the goals of this policy :

- To minister to the spiritual, physical and emotional needs of the abused child and family as well as the Catholic family.
- To report all incidents of child abuse to civil and diocesan authorities.
- To strengthen **all screening procedures** with the goal of preventing child abuse by diocesan and related-entity **personnel and volunteers**.
- To minister to the spiritual, physical and emotional needs of the individual who is accused of abuse.

In order to accomplish these goals, St. Ignatius is obliged to make sure that all current staff and volunteers and new staff and volunteers have completed the following forms -1)Volunteer Application, 2) Code of Conduct, 3) Screening/Background Check and attended a **Virtus Class**. **All current volunteers & employees must have these items completed by April 1, 2015. All new volunteers must complete these items before they can volunteer in any ministry.**

St Ignatius is offering a Virtus Class on **January 31st, from 3pm to 6pm in room E&F in the old school**. Anyone wishing to attend the class must pre-register by going to DRVC.org. If anyone needs assistance registering, please contact my assistant Joan Della Ratta.

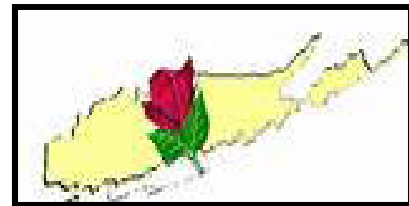

In the Gospel today, Jesus asks "What are you looking for?" Often we are looking for happiness in very selfish ways, but we find that when we look for ways to make others happy, it is then that we truly become happy.

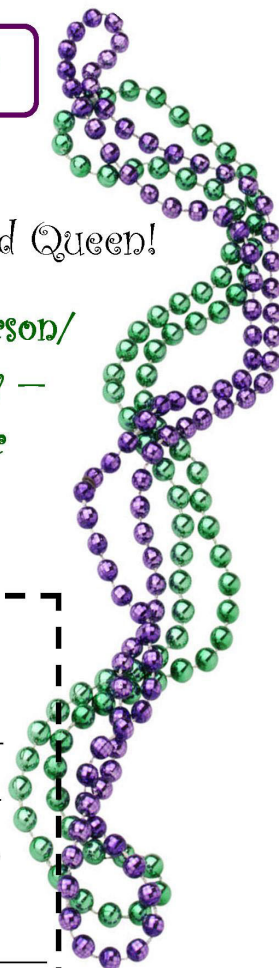
