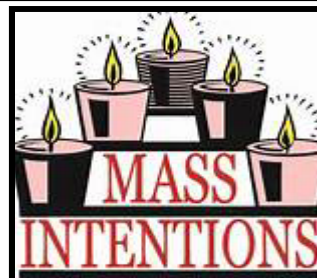

**Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**Next Sunday, February 1, 2015**

**Theme:** Jesus has power over evil.

**Breaking Open the Word:** Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Mk 1:21-28

*Then they came to Capernaum, and on the Sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.*

**Step One: Listen to the Word:** As you hear today's Gospel with its shouting demons, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart?

**Step Two: Look into Your Life**

**Question for Children:** Name some bad things that you want to pray that Jesus will take away from our world.

**Question for Youth:** Jesus was able to free the man from the unclean spirit within him. What do you hope Jesus will free you from? What is happening in the world that needs Jesus' help?

**Question for Adults:** What are the evils in today's world that you pray God will free us from?

## CHRISTIAN UNITY WEEK

This past week we celebrated Christian Unity Week. This annual celebration unites Churches in the common quest for Christian unity. This special week was first observed in 1908 and continues to be celebrated annually from January 18<sup>th</sup> thru this Sunday January 25<sup>th</sup>. This year the scriptural theme comes from the Gospel of John where Jesus says to the Samaritan woman at the well, **"Give me a drink."** In our quest for Christian unity, Jesus will give us the living water we need for our journey. Jesus challenges us to acknowledge that diversity is part of God's design, to approach one another in trust and to see the face of God in the face of all men and women. I invite all to join in prayer and work for the communion of all, joining our prayer to that of the Lord Jesus Christ, "that all may be one" (John 17:21).

In light of Christian Unity week, I would like to share with you the following article entitled "The Origins of All Religions" by Ann Landers.

"Dear Readers: Do you have any idea when your religion was founded and by whom? I found the following fascinating. If you are a member of the **Jewish faith, your religion was founded by Abraham about 4,000 years ago**. If you are a Hindu, your religion developed in India around 1500 B.C. If you are a Buddhist, your religion split from Hinduism, and was founded by Buddha, Prince Siddhartha Gautama of India, about 500 B.C.

**If you are Roman Catholic, Jesus Christ began your religion in the year 33**. If you are Islamic, Mohammed started your religion in what is now Saudi Arabia around 600 A.D. If you are Eastern Orthodox, your sect separated from Roman Catholicism around the year 1000. If you are a Lutheran, your religion was founded by Martin Luther, an ex-monk in the Catholic Church, in 1517. If you belong to the Church of England (Anglican), your religion was founded by King Henry VIII in the year 1534 because the pope would not grant him a divorce with the right to marry.

If you are a Presbyterian, your religion was founded when John Knox brought the teachings of John Calvin to Scotland in the year 1560. If you are a Unitarian, your religious group developed in Europe in the 1600's.

If you are a Congregationalist, your religion branched off from Puritanism in the early 1600's in England. If you are a Baptist, you owe the tenets of your religion to John Smyth, who launched it in Amsterdam in 1607. If you are a Methodist, your religion was founded by John and Charles Wesley in England in 1744. If you are an Episcopalian, your religion was brought over from England to the American colonies and formed a separate church founded by Samuel Seabury in 1789. If you are a Mormon (Latter-Day Saints), Joseph Smith started your church in Palmyra, NY, not Salt Lake City, which would have been my guess. The year was 1830.

If you worship with the Salvation Army (yes, it's a religious group, not just an organization that collects money in kettles on Christmas and serves dinners to the homeless), your sect began with William Booth in London in 1865. If you are a Christian Scientist, you look to 1879 as the year your religion was founded by Mary Baker Eddy. If you are a Jehovah Witness, your religion was founded by Charles Taze Russell in Pennsylvania in the 1870's. If you are Pentecostal, your church was started in the US in 1901. If you are agnostic, you profess an uncertainty or a skepticism about the existence of God or a Higher Being. If you are an atheist, you do not believe in the existence of God or any other higher power. This country's best-known atheist, Madalyn Murray O'Hair, disappeared without a trace, according to her son".

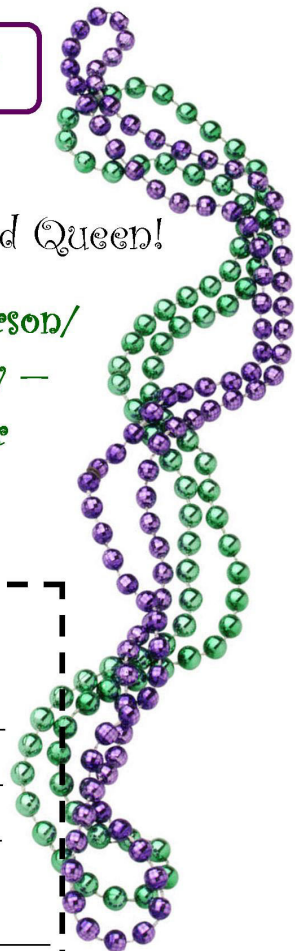

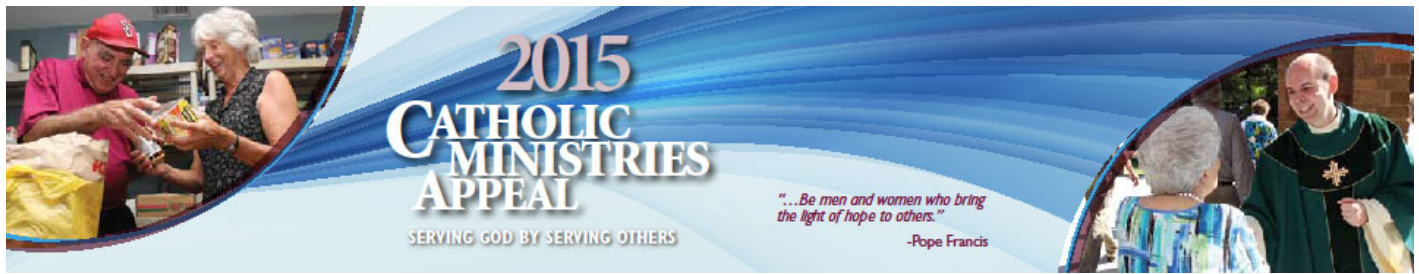
