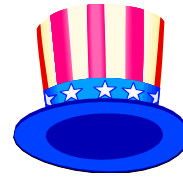

Boats left beyond this date or boats without current WLE registration will be removed. Fine and storage fee will need to be paid before boat can be claimed. Boats not claimed in 180 days will be auctioned. Non-power boats must be registered each year and a current WLE sticker must be displayed. The \$25 fee must also be paid. Boats will have a designated spot on the boat rack on first come first serve basis. Once you choose your spot you must then come in to the office to register your boat, let us know the number you're in, and get your sticker. The association has the right to limit the amount of boats at each area.</p>



May - October	IN FRONT OF THE WAYNE COUNTY VISITORS CENTER 32 COMMERCIAL STREET, HONESDALE 	<p>The Wayne County Farmers' Market is a weekly marketplace for farmers and producers throughout Northeastern PA and Southern NY to sell their produce and goods. The selection of vegetable changes with the seasons, but here is always a wide variety of locally produced household items, baked goods and decorative items.</p> <p>In the Spring look for radishes, onions, crisp lettuce, salad greens, dark leafy greens, bedding plants, trees, shrubs and more.</p> <p>The Summer holds a bountiful harvest of berries, broccoli, zucchini, summer squash, peas, beans, tomatoes in many colors, shapes and sizes, peppers, eggplant, cucumbers, sweet corn, cantaloupe, watermelon and a variety of herbs. If you're into canning for Winter just ask one of our farmers about a larger order.</p> <p>When the leaves start to color in the Fall we'll have plenty of apples, pears, root vegetables, leeks, winter squash, cabbage, turnips, Brussels sprouts, and pumpkins.</p> <p>Our goal is to help the residents of Wayne County eat locally and participate in a local economy. There's no better peace of mind about our food than to know the farmer who grew it. The practice of eating locally is an easy, positive step toward a sustainable future and a cleaner, safer environment. By participating in your local economy your dollars stay in the community and go directly to the farmer or producer. also many of our Farm vendors accept WIC Farmers' Market checks.</p>

WLE RECYCLE INFORMATION

<p>Glass Bottles</p> 	<p>Empty and rinse. Discard caps and tops. Labels can stay on. Separate by colors — clear, brown & green. DO NOT BREAK GLASS.</p> <p>Do not include with glass bottles: windows, mirrors, light bulbs, white glass, dishes, drinking glasses, pyrex, heat tempered glass or ceramics.</p>
<p>Metal Cans</p> 	<p>All food and beverage cans (aluminum & tin.) Empty and rinse. Labels may stay on.</p> <p>Do not include with metal cans: pie plates, foil, paint cans, aerosol cans, pots and pans, fuel tanks, coat hangers or other metal items.</p>
<p>Plastic Bottles</p> 	<p>BOTTLES ONLY</p> <p>Milk, soda, water and detergent bottles marked with  or  on the bottom. Empty and rinse. Discard caps.</p> <p>Do not include with plastic bottles: plastic bags, tubs, trays, toys or other plastic items, even if they are labeled  or . No styrofoam. No plastic bottles with a 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7 inside the recycling symbol. No motor oil bottles.</p>
<p>Newspapers</p> 	<p>Includes clean newspapers and newspaper inserts. Keep dry, clean and out of sunlight. Place in neat stacks and tie with heavy string or twine. Do not tie with plastic, wire, cloth or pantyhose. May also be placed in brown grocery bags.</p> <p>Do not include with newspapers: phone books, junk mail, cardboard or magazines.</p>
<p>Magazines</p> 	<p>Includes catalogs, magazines, junk mail and phone books. Tie with heavy string or twine separately from newspaper. Do not tie with plastic, wire, cloth or pantyhose. May also be placed in brown grocery bags.</p> <p>Do not include with magazines: cardboard, newspapers, hardback books.</p>

Please take special note that just because an item is marked RECYCLABLE or is marked with the recycling arrows does NOT automatically mean it is recyclable under our program.
