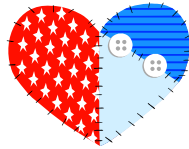

CHEYENNE HERITAGE QUILTERS BY-LAWS

1. The name of this organization shall be Cheyenne Heritage Quilters.
2. The purpose or mission of **Cheyenne Heritage Quilters** shall be to 1) encourage and broaden quilters' creativity and share with others their quilting knowledge, 2) sponsor the bi-annual quilt show, and 3) **contribute charitable and educational experiences** to the community.
3. The CHQ year will run from September 1 through August 31. **Guild meetings will on be the first and third Mondays of at 7:00 p.m. in September, October, November, January, February, March, April and May; on the 1st Monday of the month in December; and on the 3rd Monday of the month in June, July, and August.**
4. **Membership dues of \$15.00 per year are due in September. Anyone joining after March 1 will pay dues of \$7.50.**
5. A Board of Directors will consist of three elected officers and the committee chairs. The Board will meet once a month or as needed. Dates for Board meetings will be announced at meetings and published in the monthly newsletter. Board meetings will be open for attendance by the general membership of the Guild.
6. **OFFICERS:** The President, Vice-President, and Secretary-Treasurer will be elected **at** the second meeting in May and **will** take office **on** September 1. Each term of office shall be one year. **Elected officers may hold the position for no more than two consecutive years.**

President. The President's duties will be to preside at **Guild** meetings, to conduct the Board meetings, and to oversee committees.

Vice-President. **The Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Program Committee. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President, shall perform the duties of that office.**

Secretary-Treasurer. **The Secretary-Treasurer will maintain control over the accounting and banking for the Guild, will receive and record receipt of all dues and other income, will pay and record payment of all expenditures, and will maintain the membership list. A monthly report of income and expenses shall be presented at the Board meetings.**
7. **STANDING COMMITTEES.** **Chairpersons of each of the Standing Committees will be appointed by the incoming officers before the first September meeting. The Chairpersons are responsible to obtain additional committee members from the Guild as needed, to ensure the accomplishment of their committee's responsibilities and to orient the next year's committee chairpersons as to their responsibilities.**
8. The By-laws will be reviewed each year in April and voted on **at the second meeting** in May.

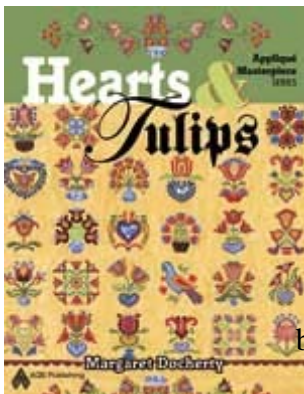

Hearts and Tulips, Applique Masterpiece Series, Margaret Docherty, c. 2008

The exquisite appliqué mastery of Margaret Docherty returns in this bold, colorful collection of folk art style birds and tulips. Thirty-five different designs can be used for any type or size hand- or machine-appliqué project as well as the featured quilt, giving Hearts and Tulips tremendous versatility and utility. By-the-book quilters and those who prefer to branch out and design their own work will use Hearts and Tulips as both pattern and inspiration.

Margaret's original art fits 7" to 8" blocks. All of her designs may be enlarged to fit up to 12" blocks, making the book very versatile. Paying homage in part to Pennsylvania Dutch design, the book will serve as a pattern resource for years to come for appliquéers of all skill levels. As always, Margaret's instructions are clear and concise, allowing quilters of any experience to achieve stunning results.

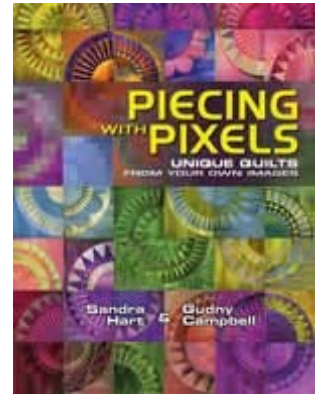

Piecing with Pixels, Unique Quilts from Your Own Images, Sandra Hart and Gudny Campbell, c. 2009

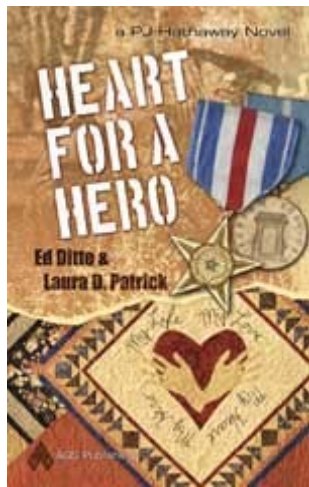
Who ever thought your camera and computer could be your most valuable quilting tools? Going far beyond the concept of simply transferring photos to fabric, the authors show you how to transform your favorite photos into dazzling quilts.

Learn how to 'piece' traditional blocks and original 'appliqué' designs using Adobe® Photoshop® Elements software to create, modify, embellish, and print the designs directly onto fabric. The intriguing digital projects include easy-to-follow step-by-step instructions. It is fun and efficient to copy, resize, and reprint your blocks to create larger or smaller quilts, table runners, pillows, or note cards. You'll love using common images in uncommon ways, creating fabrics for your own wonderfully unique quilts.



Collectively, this talented California team has been quilting for nearly 50 years. Both are enthusiastic teachers. Gudny is a PC expert who also teaches painting on fabric. Sandra is a Macintosh expert who has been teaching how to print images onto fabric and incorporate them into quilts. Together they teach workshops on their digital-quilting technique.

Heart for a Hero, Ed Ditto & Laura D. Patrick, c. 2009



Losing your love is like losing yourself. It happened to Bebe Warner fifty years ago, and it's happening to her granddaughter PJ today. Nobody ever suspected that Bebe perfect wife, perfect grandmother, and quilter extraordinaire led a secret life. Not even PJ, though she's desperately guarding a secret of her own.

Author Ed Ditto's novel takes inspiration from his cousin Laura D. Patrick's homey quilt to cover deep themes of loss and regret, acceptance and recovery. Historical accuracy concerning the Korean War and a searing look at post-partum depression interwoven with the healing powers of quilting make this novel appealing to numerous audiences.

Author Ed Ditto and quiltmaker Laura D. Patrick are cousins who live not very far apart in southern Tennessee and northern Alabama, respectively. This is their first collaborative project.
