Gov. Thomas Broughton on 17 Mar. 1735 to John, Henry & David Girardin. A knife delivered in lieu of the whole. Witness: Gabriel Ravot, John Bourquin. Before John Bourquin, JP. William Hopton Register

JOHN LINDER, planter of St. Bartholomews Parish, Colleton Co. & Jane (formerly JANE CROLL, daughter & one of the co-heiresses of WILLIAM CROLL, planter, of Colleton Co.) to John LOGAN, merchant, of Charleston for 1500 lb. SC money, 373 acres originally granted William Croll, bounding NE on vacant land, E on Mr. Drayton, S on vacant land, SW on Roger Sanders & William Clifford, N on John Cockran & vacant land; also **327 acres** granted William Croll, bounding E on William Croll, S on Mr. Kelly, N & W on Mr. Champney; also **500 acres**, part of Bayly' Barony or Land gravate, formerly bounding on all sides on vacant land; also **200 acres** granted Brian Kelly, to the W of the freshes of the Edisto River; with in land near the Round od Savannah,, then bounding on vacant land; total **1400 acres** Colleton County; also their 2 undivided thirds part of **377 acres** & houses thereon, bounding on Thomas Paine. Where as Lt. Gov. Thomas Broughton granted William Croll **373 acres** in Colleton Co.(Secretary's Office Book G-G, folder 211) & on 7 Aug 1735 granted William Croll **327 acres** (Secretary's Office Book C-C, folder 43) & whereas John Bayly of Ballinacclough Co. of Tipperary Ireland, son & heir of John Bayly, Esq. of same place, by Alexander Trench, his attorney by L & R dated 21 & 22 Sept. 1731 sold William Croll & Thomas McKee **500 acres**, but McKee dying intestate, Croll became sole owner; where as Croll by certain conveyances owned **200 acres** originally owned by Brian Kelly; total **1400 acres** in Colleton Co; Where as Croll also owned **377 arces** bounding on Thomas Paine's land; by will dated 4 Nov 1743 devised to Jane Croll now wife of John Linder & Margaret Croll, his two eldest daughters, his **1527 acres** in Colleton Co, bounding on

James Boggs vacant land, Meller St. John, on John Carmichael, to gether with his dwelling house & other tenement; bequeathed to Elizabeth Croll, his youngest daughter now wife of John Logan, the **377 acre** tract which was signed by only two witnesses & therefore not legally good, the land descended to his three daughters (Jane & Margaret, sister by the same mother; Elizabeth by

another "venter, Now wife of John Logan) as co-partners & whereas Margaret died in her infancy & Jane as heiress whole blood inherited Margaret's third; now Jane & her husband sell their 2/3 to John Logan & Elizabeth his wife. Witnesses James Kirkwood, Joseph Sanders, Kirkwood testified before James Grindlay. JP 1 Apr 1761. Recorded 25 May 1761 by William Hopton, Register.

Nicholas (his mark) Winkler, planter of St, Peter's Parish to John Linder, planter for 40 lbs. currency 100 acres in Puryburgh Township granted 17 March 1735 by Gov Thomas Broughton to Andrew Winkler, next eldest brother of Nicholas; bounding S on Davis Souise; E on Pierre Galashes; N on Adam Quilliat; W on Jean Heiway Garding. Wit. Mary Meisner, Lewis (his mark) Winkler, Stephen Cater. Before Fenwicke Bull J P & Register.

Henry Jeanneret, planter of St. Peter's Parish, Granville Co. & Ursula his wife to Stephan Cater, Esq. of Dorchester for 1700 lbs. currency, 700 acres in St. Peter's Parish granted to Henry Jeanneret & Michael Bokrer. Wit. Henry Saltus, John Linder, Mary Meisner. Before J. Skene, JP. Recorded 26 Oct 1765 by Fenwicke Bull, Register.

Abel Evans & Thomas Evans, planters of Plumfield of the Welch Tract, Craven Co to William Killingsworth Sr. planter of same place for 200 lbs. currency 125 acres in the Welch Tract, granted by Gov. James Glen on 6 Dec 1744 to Thomas Evans of Plumfield, bounding S on a vacant swamp, W on Peedee River & vacant land , N on Philip Douglas. Wit. David Evans, Philip Howell. Before William Simpson JP, William Hopton Register.

William Killingsworth, gentleman to George Dudley, gentleman, both of Amelia Township for 200 lbs. currency 125 acres whereas by L & R dated 7 & 8 Jan 1760, Frederick Mathews, tailor, of Charleston sold Killingsworth 250 acres in said Township on southside of Santee River, bounding E on Samuel Jordan. SW on Samuel Jordan & vacant land; NW on vacant land. Now Killingsworth sells upper half to Dudley & reserves lower half for his son Jacob Killingsworth. Wit. Thomas Lennon, John Killingsworth. Lennon testified 2 Oct 1761 before Moses Thomson JP. recorded 22 Sept. 1762. William Hopton, Register.

William Killingsworth, gentleman of Amelia Township to Aaron Reily & Charles Carson merchants for 358: 15: 6 lbs. currency, 300 acres on NE side of Santee River opposite Amelia Township; 275 acres on NE side Peedee River 20 head cattle, 3 horses, 2 mare, 2 colts, 4 feather beds, all his pewter & household furniture. Redeemable 1 March next. Wit. Thomas Lennon, Thomas Pond. Before Moses Thompson, JP (Secretary Book Z-Z pg 205 - 206. 5 Jun 1762. Recorded 2 Jul 1765.

Lewis Linder, surveyor of Orangeburg, Berkeley Co. & Ann his wife to Peter Manegault, barrister at law of Charleston for 333 lbs. currency for 133 1/3 acres part pf

400 acres in St Mathews Parish. Bounded by other 2/3,

now estate of said Peter Manegault.

John Linder, planter to David Giroud, planter both of St. Peters Parish for 5750 lbs. currency, 11 negro men, 8 negro woman, 5 children; also 5 adjoining tracts of land in Purysburg Township. viz. 250 acres granted John Henry Gerardin, 100 acres granted Andrew Winkler, 400 acres granted John Linder, 400 acres granted Thomas Linder, 450 acres granted John Linder. Wit. Adrian Mayer. George Keall, Andrew D'Ellient. Before George Murray JP 22 Oct 1768. Recorded 5 Feb 1770.
