

Strolling Player Strolling Player With Richard Sheridan Willis

Strolling Player is a creative project with a utilitarian inspiration. When English actor Richard Sheridan Willis married Canadian writer Heidi Reimer, they applied for his Canadian residency. One grueling immigration form demanded a list of Richard's location and activities each month since his eighteenth birthday. The years had been dictated by the vagaries and upheavals of an actor's life. Age eighteen was a long time ago.

Strolling Player began as a blog giving the heart behind the facts on the government form, and metamorphosed into theatre when producer Lisa Dent-Couturier asked Richard for a one-man performance. Together Richard and Heidi shaped this accounting into a celebration of love and artistic dreams.

There's the paparazzi stalking a doomed marriage. There's the fall off the stage on an opening night. A backstage brawl and a wedding ring, flung into a parking lot. Debilitating tours across America. A father's seaside theatre, where the dream began, and that father's death many years later. Rehearsal in New York on 9/11, a performance for George Bush at The White House, a break-up in Venice. Brushes with Daniel Day Lewis, Richard Burton, Dr. Who, Oscar Wilde. And Shakespeare, his first love. Always, there is Shakespeare.

And there is that beautiful, dark Northern Ontario girl, and a redemptive wedding at a Northern Ontario Lake, and a life story written out for Canadian Immigration so that they could be together. A life story turned into a play.

Richard has appeared on **Flashpoint**, **Law & Order**, **Nikita**, **Dr. Who**, **Lost Girl**, and numerous TV series. He appeared in Toronto in **The Master Builder** at the Royal Alexandra Theatre with Alan Bates and Gemma Jones, and was last seen in Toronto as the Father in **The Railway Children**. He has just finished performing in Washington DC at the Folger Shakespeare Theatre, playing the Chorus in **Henry V** and his acclaimed performance as Malvolio in **Twelfth Night**.

Lucas Wilson is Strolling Player's Technical Director and is best known for his work as an illusionist. He has appeared on **Canada's Got Talent** and made a successful pitch on **The Dragon's Den**. According to **The Guinness Book of World Records**, Lucas is officially the world's fastest straitjacket escape artist. Here he helps Richard and the

Lisa Dent-Couturier as well as being producer of Strolling Player will be dividing her time between Toronto and Stratford where her son Arden is playing the young Tommy in the Stratford Festival's **Tommy** directed by Des McAnuff.

Robert Richmond directs Strolling Player. He lives in Columbia, SC, where he is an Associate Professor in Theatre at the University of South Carolina. He has known and collaborated with Richard for 25 years. He is known for his inventive productions of Shakespeare. His off-Broadway hit production of *Comedy of Errors* was brought to La Jolla Playhouse by **Des McAnuff**. This year he directed the critically acclaimed **Henry V** at the Folger Shakespeare Theatre in Washington DC, which became the best-selling show in the theatre's history. He has just directed **Twelfth Night** at the Folger and will return there to direct **Richard III** in 2014.
