

As many of you know, Epsilon Chapter's Charter was suspended by the Executive Committee of Sigma Chi in 2000. The Epsilon Housing Trust (EHT) owns the real estate that the Epsilon Chapter occupied since the early 1950's. In order to preserve a Sigma Chi presence on the campus of The George Washington University, the Directors and Officers of the EHT determined that keeping its premier location on the GW campus would be appropriate. Thus, EHT entered into a three year lease with the alumni of the Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity (LCA) for the benefit of their undergraduate brothers. Currently, the LCA undergraduates and alumni appear to be fulfilling the terms of their lease and, to date, have been good tenants. When the

time is right, the Epsilon alumni will seek to re-charter a Sigma Chi Chapter at GW. This effort will require the assistance of many DC area alumni - we hope that you will consider contributing your time and talent to this important undertaking. The next EHT meeting is 2/28/02 at 7pm in the University Club at George Washington University, on the corner of 20th and F Street in NW, Washington. Space is limited.
