The Living Ritual

My recent experiences at Sigma Chi Alumni Training in Nashville have had a profound effect on my view of our fraternity and the many aspects of it. The training provided me with a myriad of exciting, new ideas on what I can do to advance our organization, and grow as a Sig in the process. I was able to meet men of truly different temperaments, talents and convictions all with a common interest: the prosperity of Sigma Chi. I have an amazing perspective on how business in the fraternity is done at the International level and what my role as an alumnus should be. Above all, I have a renewed fervor for the lifelong commitment I've made to Sigma Chi and a greater appreciation for the main reason we all continue active membership in this fraternity.... The Ritual.

Many organizations have some type of ritual. Some are very informal and loosely structured; others are very formal and precisely worded. Various ritual of a public nature exists all around us. Fraternity ritual is of a different sort all together. It is guarded and secret. In many cases it stays locked away in a dark cabinet, ignored, only to be opened, viewed, and used for a short period - maybe once a semester. At that point the ritual takes precedence and be-

comes important again. People scramble to memorize lines and clamber to perform in a dimly lit room. For a brief moment, the ritual is presented with great feeling and seriousness. For those seeing it for the first time, it's probably an emotional experience. This rarely lasts, however, because within a few hours it's back to collecting dust until next semester.

This is not the case with Sigma Chi. From the moment of our initiation, we have all seen that this ritual is different. Often times, I see Sigs reading the ritual, discussing it, and sometimes even arguing about its meaning. Some are inclined to memorize it, not because its required, but because they have a desire to. Those actions exemplify the ritual of Sigma Chi.- the living ritual.

Why do we refer to our ritual as living? I've recently thought about this question and answered it for myself. Our ritual serves us in chapter meetings and in our daily lives, alike. Although it can be used in various capacities, when you peel away the layers, the essence of our ritual is fundamentally a system of values. While outrritual rarely changes, it is far from a static entity. It is the product of history and the spirit of man and how he relates to


