#### JOB AVAILABLE

Patton Boggs' marketing department is currently seeking the acquisition of a department intern for the spring and summer semesters of 2003. This position would be unpaid (however a stipend is being considered and the amount being discussed is \$1,500/sem.). We are asking that the individual perform 20-25 hours/week. Basically, 3-4 hours a day in the afternoon, though we can compromise.

This position will provide the individual with exposure to a professional office setting as well as the inner-workings of a large law firm. This position is ideal for any student considering law school, but would like more information on the inner workings of the law firm/legal culture.

Recommended duties that the intern would assume, in whole or in part:

- assistance with brochure and collateral production;
- assistance with compilation of new attorney biographies, familiarizing the individual with terminology and background data on lawyers;
- assistance in facilitating the large, special projects related to print items and marketing efforts:
- gathering media contact information for various publications in an effort to pitch stories and disseminate news releases;
- aiding the assistant to the Chief Marketing Officer (CMO) in gathering information related to budgetary matters, client data/research and press avenues;
- processing data that may be extracted from the department's baseline survey a survey that samples the surrounding community, inquiring about perceptions of the law firm culture, and
- carrying out miscellaneous tasks that will undoubtedly assist and promote the department.

Brother Vincent White will directly supervise the intern in performance of all duties and tasks to fulfillment. In addition, he will act as liaison between the Marketing Department members and the intern to ensure good time management and diversity in experience.

Lastly, if the college/university credit program requires that a periodical report be issued summarizing the progress and accomplishments of the intern, he would bear the responsibility therein.
