Job well done; all of you are worthy of being members of Capital City or any alumni Chapter for that matter. The political process of the General Fraternity, like most political processes, is not the most pleasant. Unfortunately, I must personally, as a SIG, acknowledge my negative experiences within this process. I am not unhappy in any way, just articulating a point of view. I truly feel blessed to have had the opportunity to be somewhat involved on the International Fraternity level since 1991.

The next Grand Chapter is scheduled in June 2005 in Cincinnati Ohio. This will be the 75<sup>th</sup> Grand Chapter and Sigma Chi will host this Grand Chapter close to our founding site, University of Miami at Ohio. At this Grand Chapter, as I have stated to many times, I will not allow my name to stand for any International office appointed or elected. Twenty-Four (24) years as a SIG, twenty (20) years since graduating from George Washington University and three (3) unsuccessful Grand Praetor bids has

made me come to the realization that a General Fraternity office was not meant for me. My experience with the General Fraternity election process is over and I have completed legitimate service to the Order. I thank all who have supported me over the years and I am grateful to all of the Brothers whom I have met and worked with over these many years. I have finished my work and, to be honest, I was happiest being a Capital City's first voting Delegate at the 74<sup>th</sup> Grand Chapter, an opportunity which has been closed to many recent alumni in the area for sometime. As I plan for retirement, Capital City needs to think of whom they will send to the 75<sup>th</sup> Grand Chapter in 2005. Brothers, feel honored that you are now reading the James E. Montgomery 2003 Alumni Publication Award winning newsletter. The Fraternity annually recognizes the most outstanding alumni chapter publications with the Montgomery Award, named for the late Indiana newspaper publisher James E. Montgomery (Butler & Stanford, 1908). A committee of alumni journalists evaluates alumni group publications received at Headquarters on the basis of frequency, content



and balance, writing and editing, general appearance, effectiveness, and overall quality. The Capital City Alumni Chapter was awarded the title at the 2003 Grand Chapter. I was not aware that Capital City was to be honored with this Award; I was sitting in the audience when it was announced and was a little shocked. Nonetheless, I knew that we had a good product. We truly report the SIG news as it comes to us in a well-balanced format. Our editor Mike Lally deserves significant credit for making sure that Capital City publishes the Capital City Constantine on a regular basis and all of you have contributed to the

Special thanks to Grant Olan, our past Awards Committee Chairman, for his effort in gathering the information needed for this award. The Alumni Chapter Excellence Award recognizes not just one individual's efforts to improve the alumni experience, but the accomplishments of an entire chapter. This biennial award was conceptualized and is sponsored by Constantine SIG Bruce Morgan Casner (Epsilon '71), Past President of the Washington, D.C. Alumni Chapter and 1978 recipient of the Jay Minton Outstanding Alumni Officer Award. It honors those alumni chapters that strive toward excellence in all aspects of program and operation including: Membership Fulfillment: programming and services that fulfill the interests and needs of area alumni; Undergraduate Support: assisting area undergraduates improve and strengthen their Sigma Chi experience through healthy interaction and assistance; Community Involvement: assisting and supporting alumni members in demonstrating the ideals of Sigma Chi in their daily lives and community.




For The Good Jon Miller, Eastern Province Grand Praetor

## Listserv Rules Bob Grabowski - KP '01

Thank you to all of you who responded to my first email regarding this issue. I have come up with the following email that I am going to send to the entire Capital City Alumni chapter. After I send it, I will reopen the listserve to everyone's use. I will send it out around noon tomorrow. You have until then to email me with any MAJOR concerns regarding the email. If I don't hear from anyone, it will be sent out as is. Here it is:

Brothers, the Capital City LISTSERV is designed to allow informative communications among our membership and with other SIGs who desire to receive such information. It is not a forum for open discussion or debate. Our aim in opening the LISTSERV is to ensure that when someone opens a message from Capital City, positive and informative information is provided therein. We do not want to run the risk that when our members receive an email from the LISTSERV, the Brother will automatically delete the message. As such, we have developed some fundamental rules for all to follow in using the list serve. They are as follows:

1) Please use cautiously, always keeping in mind that over 70 brothers are on this LISTSERV. Most, if not all, brothers do not wish to have their inboxes flooded with email from our LISTSERV.

2) Any email proposing new business for the Capital City Alumni chapter should be emailed directly to any member of the executive committee and NOT BROADCASTED TO THE ENTIRE LISTSERV. The executive committee member will then send this to the entire executive committee for the appropriate follow-up. To make this easier, at the footer of every message, the email addresses of all the Executive Board members will be listed. Please contact them directly with any questions or proposals.

3) Any email that sparks any type of debate whatsoever is strictly prohibited. If a valid concern needs to be brought up to the entire chapter, please email this to any member of the executive committee ONLY.

4) Various numbers of announcements are welcome, always keeping in mind Rule #1 on this list.

5) Any response to any announcements located in Rule #4 should be sent ONLY to the brother making the announcement.
