Runkle Remembered Ryan Harmon, AN '99

B athed in sunlight while nestled between tree shadows, courage rest. On September 6th, our brothers stood united to pay tribute to Founder Runkle. While we had never met the man, we have felt his grip through hands of our brothers and witnessed the affect of his courage upon our lives.

Founder Runkle spoke of the

courageous acts witnessed during the Civil War in his address to the Grand Chapter entitled "True Manhood". He professed to the brothers that Courage is not an animal instinct, but strong conviction to act for Purpose. To them, he posed this charge:

"Oh, ye sons and successors of the heroic dead, can you, can any young American, in the face of these examples of true manhood, make the mere getting of money, the enjoyment of luxury, the climbing into place by the disgraceful means in common use, the aim and end of life?"

As we reflect upon his words, let us be mindful of courage while we seek to make our lives an exemplary expression.

For The Good Jon Miller, Eastern Province Grand Praetor

I have just finished reading a book called "Leading Change." This reading has resulted in my thinking a lot about the changes that either have taken place or need to take place within Sigma Chi. As you would expect, the book's author has a lot to say about leadership and management framed within the context of the vision of the organization. And so I ask the questions:

What is our vision?

Who are the leaders? Who are the managers?

One characteristic of Sigma Chi is its steadfastness in vision or purpose: friendship, justice and learning. What was true in 1855 is true today. We value that. What has changed is that the achievement of our great aims was done one way in 1855, another way in 1962 and the way we find it in 2003. In 1962 we viewed hazing as tolerated. Today, hazing is not tolerated though is a natural tendency for hazing to creep back; vigilance is part to my expectation. The burning question is, "How does the province achieve a greater focus on friendship, justice and leaning?"

I believe the vision of the Eastern Province needs to change. I perceive that the province is viewed as part of an organizational hierarchy devoted to administering the undergraduate chapter's relationship with Sigma Chi International... and some loosely defined geographic relationship with Alumni Chapters. Contrast this with a vision of the province as a "union of Sigma Chi's promoting friendship, justice and learning." Suddenly, my role moves from one of managing to a shared role of leading and managing. Who else leads and manages? You do!

Our charge addresses our being ready assist, console, comfort and provide hope. Are we? We have three alumni chapters? Is their focus inward or outward? We have 5 undergraduate chapters/colonies. Is their focus inward or outward? Our boundaries establish limits that cloud our ability to achieve our three great aims.

Before I say too much, let me just say that I think we need to discuss change in a healthy context. And so, I ask each alumni chapter to develop a "statement of purpose" which addresses its relationship with the other chapters, both undergraduate and alumni. I ask that this be completed by the end of the calendar year. In addition, I am asking each alumni chapter to appoint a member to the Province Coordination Committee. This committee will promote synergism for such actives as conferences, workshops and province wide events. This appointment needs to be made by December 1. Both of these requests are extremely important.

What is our vision? You need to help me define it!

Who are the leaders? Those that step up to the plate!

Who are the managers? Those who follow through!

Who are the Sigma Chis? We all are!

Vote On Amendment to Statute 5.01

Brothers:

Attached is official notification and mail ballot for a proposed statutory change of the Fraternity's Governing Laws. Grand Consul Beauchamp has asked for your special attention to this issue. You are urged to consider and vote on this matter promptly, but in no event later than November 11, 2003.

Please return the mail ballot in the envelope provided for that purpose.

The purpose of the proposed amendment to Statute 5.01 is to provide the opportunity for a more efficient and effective management of Fraternity assets, a more efficient and effective administration of Fraternal matters and a more efficient and effective custody of historical and educational artifacts of the Fraternity.

It is believed by the Executive Committee that the current statutory language will not provide the flexibility necessary to effectuate changes that allow for the efficiencies desired.

It is also recognized by the Executive Committee that action on the proposed amendment by mail ballot will allow a more timely and broader representation from all chapters to make their position known, as opposed to waiting roughly nine months for the next Grand Council meeting.

There is no anticipated financial burden associated with the passing of the proposed amendment. In fact, one of the purposes behind the proposal is to allow for the implementation of efficiencies which may result in cost savings.

The proposed amendment has been endorsed by the Governing Laws Committee and certified by the Executive Committee for mail ballot vote.

Your Executive Committee recommends a vote IN FAVOR of the amendment.
