About the Potomac Valley Rescue Group

PVRG is:

-an SGA-recognized student organization at the University of Maryland -composed primarily of University of Maryland undergraduate students -one of nine member teams of the Appalachian Search and Rescue Conference -a recognized resource of the Maryland Emergency Management Agency -Explorer Search and Rescue Post 617

Search and Rescue

The main purpose of PVRG is to provide all-weather search and rescue services, in the mid-Atlantic region, as one of nine member teams of the Appalachian Search and Rescue Conference. The ASRC primarily searches for missing/lost persons and overdue/downed aircraft. PVRG is on call 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to respond to any search operation for which we are requested. Members range in qualification from Call Out Qualified, with one weekend of training, to Incident Commander, which takes years of experience and training.

Most of our searches occur in Maryland, Virginia, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. We search in all weather conditions, except for electrical storms, and in any terrain, from the suburban developments of Columbia, MD to the wilderness areas of Shenandoah National Park.

At a search, we provide leadership, communications, navigation, and medical support. Our team works with dog teams, law enforcement, firefighters, Civil Air Patrol members, and volunteers to help find missing persons, provide them with medical care, and transport them to professional first responders.

Disaster Response

These same skills also make our team a valuable asset in times of disaster. PVRG is called upon by the Maryland Emergency Management Agency to assist in disaster situations. This past September, we were on alert and ready to respond to any problems that may have occurred due to Hurricane Isabel. In 1992, the ASRC was called upon to provide assistance in Florida following Hurricane Andrew. Recently, some of our team members have received FEMA training to better respond to disaster areas. We plan to start one of these training programs to help community groups better prepare for emergency situations.

Community Service and Other Activities

When we are not training for an participating in search and rescue operations, we help to provide first aid for community events, clean up local parks, and assist in community service activities.

PVRG Highlights

- > This year we trained 23 members to respond to searches
- > Total number of members: 41
- > In 1997 PVRG received the Diamond Award for Community Service
- > We will be celebrating our 15 year anniversary in fall of 2004
- > We are the only college-based SAR team in MD
- > As a volunteer, no PVRG member is paid for their services

> Members go on to take classes in subjects including mantracking, incident command, cave rescue, and technical rescue.

> Members build upon their foundations in PVRG and become firefighters, paramedics, SAR dog handlers, Coast Guard, law enforcement agents, and use the skills we teach to help communities around the country.

Why PVRG Needs Funding:

Until this year, PVRG has relied upon a used Ford ambulance to transport team members and equipment to searches. However, this vehicle no longer works, and we were forced to put it up for auction, and begin looking for a replacement vehicle. Due to a University funding cap, the SGA is only able to contribute \$4800 to our new vehicle (including maintenance and fuel). By selling our previous vehicle, we have raised \$1288. We are seeking corporate donations to help us raise an additional \$9,000 for this program. Any donations not used for the initial purchase and modification will be used for annual vehicle expenses.

Vehicle Description

A single used vehicle could easily be modified to serve as PVRG's flagship. A standard SUV, pickup, or minivan could be professionally painted with our logo and those of our supporters, and outfitted with a rooftop container for additional storage and our radio antenna. Inside, our GPS/radio units and laptop could provide us with mobile communications and improve navigation. Essential search supplies, in labeled containers, would be easily accessed at the search site, and extra gear could be brought using our 4'x6' trailer.

This Will Allow Us To:

Respond Quickly

By having a single vehicle with the needed equipment, we can have our first team on the road quickly, without having to stop to sort through and pick up equipment. The early stages are often the most important, and having a group vehicle will allow us to get on the road quickly.

Access Isolated Areas

If possible, we'd like this vehicle to be 4 wheel drive to allow us to travel through backcountry trails, steep slopes, beach areas, and disaster sites. This would allow the vehicle to be used as a search tool, and not just a means to get to a search. It can also allow us to set up radio repeater stations on distant hill tops, to improve communications over long distances. Once the subject is found, the vehicle could be used to transport them to the nearest major road, where ambulances can take over.

Help With Search Management

Once at the site, this vehicle will allow us to assist in base operations. A search and rescue base can be set up anywhere, and is often in a crowded cabin or other tight quarters. In larger searches, base is spread over a large area, with various components in different locations. Using tarps and tents, the vehicle could be used as a location to conduct part of the search management functions, where incident command personnel could plan search tactics, debrief field teams, interview family members, or conduct communications with field teams.

Store Gear Safely

When not in service, a vehicle with tinted windows would provide a secure storage location, especially if parked at the College Park Police or Fire Station. This capacity could be enhanced by a security system, and ensure the safety of our valuable communications equipment.

Conduct Public Relations

A professional looking vehicle could greatly improve our image at public events, and allow us to attract new members, and become well known in the community. With this recognition, our ability to develop ties with other organizations will improve. Containing our equipment, the vehicle could make an excellent centerpiece for displays and demonstrations at local fairs, Maryland day, First Look Fair, school groups, scout troops, and other events.

Test New Technologies

As a research university, the University of Maryland is constantly looking at ways to improve things. This vehicle could be improved to serve as an example to the entire SAR community, about how a vehicle can be outfitted to perform better in SAR operations. There are sure to be some modifications over the life of the vehicle, to help it perform better, whether they be a simple deer whistle or solar panels for backcountry power.

Our team is growing, and developing information resources which it shares with teams across the country via the internet. As the closest volunteer SAR team to the District, accomplishments by our team could lead diplomats and representatives from around the nation and the world to have a greater understanding of the need for volunteer rescue teams.
