FFL 2009 RULES

Number of Rounds: 18

1. Each team can draft as many positions as you want, but can only keep 16 players.
2. The other 2 players that you drafted will go into the waiver pool. Turn in with your Week 4 line-up (4 Oct).
3. In order to get a player from the waivers, you must pay \$3.00 at that time or no deal. You must also drop a player from your roster to put on waivers; remember, you can only have 16 players.
4. If two or more franchise owners wish to trade players, they may do so. A trade becomes official when all parties involved have contacted the commissioner, verified the terms of the deal and approved by the Commish.
5. No trades shall be permitted after the first kickoff of the **8th** week of the NFL season. (1 Nov). **No waiver pickups or purchases allowed after the end of Week 14.**
6. If a player isn't drafted to a team, he is considered to be a free agent. The worst teams have first dibs on available free agents and waivers until noon Wednesday. After that, it's first come, first serve. A \$5.00 (purchases) or \$3.00 (waivers) charge will be required at that time. A player from your team must be dropped off and he will be placed on waivers. You cannot drop a Defense for a player...remember 16 player roster only. Defense for Defense only.
7. The Defense/special teams "*player*," unlike the field players, is an entire NFL team. It scores whenever any player on that NFL team returns a kickoff, punt, interception, opponent's fumble, blocked punt, fake punts, or field goals for touchdowns. Limiting opponents final score to a single digit, interceptions and safeties count for points as well.
8. Each week you must play and can only play:

9. You must turn in your line-up to The Commish **NLT 12:00 CST Thursday** of each week, or else your line-up from the previous week will be played. Once your line-up is turned in to the *The Commish*, whether it be noon Thursday or before, you cannot change it, except for the following reasons. [see #10 below and #11 on the next page]
10. The USAToday injury report does not come out until Friday, however, you must turn your line-up in NLT Thursday 12:00 CST. Adjustments will be made for ***injured or suspended players only***. [see #11 on next page]

11. Injury categories:

Out - player **can** be changed **Questionable** - player **can** be changed
Doubtful - player **can** be changed **Suspended** – player can be changed
Probable - player **cannot** be changed **Game Time** – player **can be changed****

- a.) No player shall be replaced in the line-up by a player who has previously played in the current week.
- b.) Players injured after Friday that end up in the “**can be changed**” category above, are eligible to be changed.
- c.) **The Commish must hear **verbally** of your “**Game Time**” change **prior** to the “Game-Time-Player’s” kick-off. The Commish has final decision no matter the standings.
- d.) Owners who drafted players that succumb to **season ending injury** prior to the first NFL season game, will be allowed to select a new player without financial penalty. The Commissioner must be immediately notified. The first kickoff of the first NFL game will nullify any season ending injury selection as described above.
