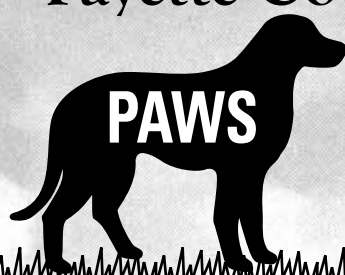

## A Message from the President



At the last board meeting of Fayette County Animal Rescue I was elected President for the year 2006. I consider this a huge honor and a great responsibility. I wanted to share with you my goals for our organization. I hope many of you can assist me in accomplishing some of them.

First of all, I would like for there to be a greater awareness of animal cruelty. Many of the people who adopt our dogs are shocked to hear about their background. They always ask me, "How could people do such terrible things to a defenseless animal?" It is hard to provide any kind of answer to that question. I want the public to know it exists and know what to do to help prevent it.

I would also like to spend more time in schools providing humane education. I feel it is very important to educate children about pet ownership and the responsibilities that go along with it. I also want children to recognize signs of animal cruelty and to be aware of what to do when they witness it. Children are so enthusiastic and many times they think of great ideas for caring for our animals and for fundraising.

Something else I would like to do this year is to provide a greater understanding of what Fayette County Animal Rescue is all about and to clear up any misconceptions people may have about a no-kill shelter. It doesn't mean we can take in every single animal that we encounter. When we are full, we are full. To take in too many animals would compromise the health and quality of life of our existing animals. Many people get angry with us when they call and we tell them we have no room. When we tell them that it means we literally have no place to put the dog or cat. We tell people to check with us later to see if any animals have been adopted and we can also put them on a waiting list. However, we are not going to euthanize any of our dogs or cats to make room for new ones who may be more adoptable. We have some animals that we feel may never get adopted, due to their temperament or physical problems. Therefore, Fayette County Animal Rescue is also a sanctuary, providing these animals a home until the end of their lives. The volunteers and staff here still love, play with and treat these animals like all the others. This is also a great place to come and learn about animals. It is an ideal and healthy place to volunteer. Studies have shown that petting animals reduces your blood pressure! Lose weight for free – walk dogs around our large fenced pen! Tone your muscles – carry 50-pound dog food bags to the pens! Who needs a gym when you have Fayette County Animal Rescue?

These are just a few of my goals for the upcoming year. There is so much more I want to do for our organization, and I hope many of you can work with us in some way. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions or suggestions. Have a Happy New Year! 🐾

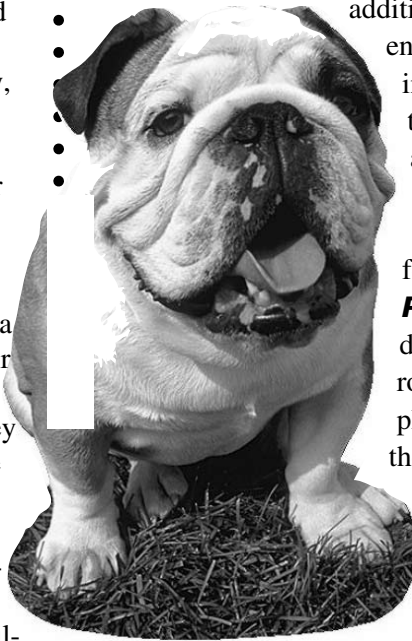
## A Story Worth Repeating...

Being a veterinarian, I had been called to examine a ten-year-old Irish Wolfhound named Belker. The dog's owners, Ron, his wife Lisa, and their little boy, Shane, were all very attached to Belker and they were hoping for a miracle. I examined Belker and found he was dying of cancer. I told the family there were no miracles left for Belker, and offered to perform the euthanasia procedure for the old dog in their home. As we made the arrangements, Ron and Lisa told me they thought it would be good for the four-year-old Shane to observe the procedure. They felt as though Shane might learn something from the experience.

The next day, I felt the familiar catch in my throat as Belker's family surrounded him. Shane seemed so calm, petting the old dog for the last time, that I wondered if he understood what was going on. Within a few minutes, Belker slipped peacefully away. The little boy seemed to accept Belker's transition without any difficulty or confusion. We sat together for a while after Belker's death, wondering aloud about the sad fact that animal lives are shorter than human lives.

Shane, who had been listening quietly, piped up, "I know why." Startled, we all turned to him. What came out of his mouth next stunned me. I'd never heard a more comforting explanation. He said, "People are born so that they can learn how to live a good life -- like loving everybody all the time and being nice, right?" The four-year-old continued, "Well, dogs already know how to do that, so they don't have to stay as long." 🐾

## "At a Glance..."

At a recent Board of Directors meeting, discussion focused on our accomplishments in 2005 and our goals for the organization in 2006. Every year FCAR has grown as an organization; rescuing more animals, adding additional community service programs and widening the circle of lives that we have impacted in our local area. In 2006 we plan to continue to pursue our lofty mission by focusing our attention on improving the quality of life for our rescues, both prior to and after they are adopted. There are 3 key areas that we will be focusing on:

**Pre-adoption:** We will be conducting a detailed analysis of our current shelter environment and will be pursuing funding to make physical improvements designed to increase the stimulation and socialization of our rescues while they are at the shelter. We will also be aggressively recruiting additional volunteers in an effort to staff recurring "Shelter Play Days" to improve the socialization and day-to-day lives of the animals. Additionally we will be implementing a Behavior Training

Program focused on increasing the adoptability of the animals, as well as improve the animal's behavior once they do find a forever home.

**Post-adoption:** We will be implementing a formalized follow up process to ensure that all new adopters have the support that they need to address any issues they encounter when bringing a new animal into their home. By opening up the lines of communication and proactively and repeatedly contacting them, our goal is to become an active support mechanism for new adopters. This will allow us the opportunity to provide guidance and address issues prior to the owner deciding to return the animal to our shelter.

**Administrative:** FCAR is now tracking all animals, medical costs, adoptions, owner information, follow ups, etc. in a database. This information will allow us the opportunity to fully analyze all aspects of the organization and identify areas that can be improved. The centralization of this data will also allow for the streamlining of administrative tasks which will ensure compliance with policies, aid in the development of new programs and improve the efficiency of the organization. In addition we will be identifying backup personnel for key tasks and document processes to reduce the dependency on any one individual to ensure the long-term success of FCAR.

We are all very excited about the prospects for 2006 and with the dedication and commitment of the Board and volunteers at FCAR this year is destined to be our best year yet! 🐾

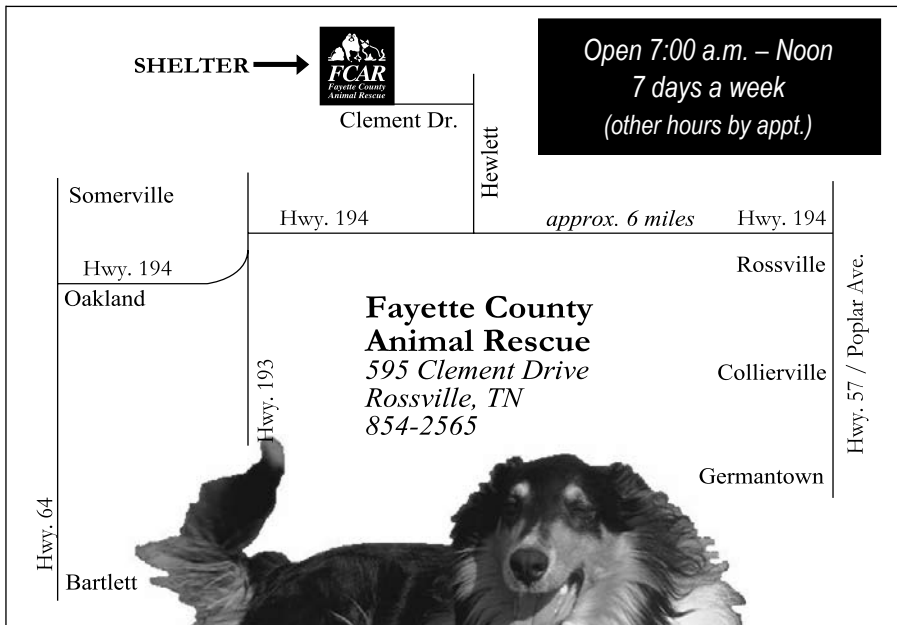
### Don Juan – Adopted 11/27/05
