Parker pulled it out of a bird's nest?

REVEAL - CAM, BRENNAN AND SCOTT STARRET

regarding the finger in a tray on the autopsy table as though it is "the victim." SCOTT STARRET is the latest grad student, late forties, earnest, seasoned -

CAM

Did he completely freak out?

7 SCOTT STARRET

When it comes to boys, that snips and snails and puppy-dogs tails thing is pretty accurate.

CAM

You have a son?

> SCOTT STARRET

I have four.

BRENNAN

Mr. Starret is my oldest grad student.

7SCOTT STARRET

Only one of my boys freaked out at dead things. The sensitive one.

(off finger)

Judging from bone size and the robust muscle attachment, the finger appears to be from a male.

ÇAM

Any daughters?

7 SCOTT STARRET

No, but all my boys had a lot of girlfriends. Not the sensitive one.

CAM

(off finger)

Not enough flesh for a print.

7 SCOTT STARRET

The scrapes on the bone and the jagged appearance here where it was severed...

BRENNAN

Chewed off by a wild animal.

CONTINUED: (2)

7 SCOTT STARRET

Very good.

(realizing)

Sorry. Condescension: Middle-aged

man default tone.

HODGINS enters, goes to a computer and begins to put a map up on the MONITOR -

HODGINS

The sticky stuff on the finger turns out to be sap from a Flowering Japanese Cherry. (to Scott Starret) I know you from somewhere.

> SCOTT STARRET

I sold you a vintage '56 Corvette in the mid-90's. You were clean shaven back then.

-CMM -

-Vou drove a Corvette?

HODGINS

It was a phase.

(to Scott Starret)

That car was a piece of crap. I don't know why I bought it.

> SCOTT STARRET

You bought it because I was a very good salesman.

(to Cam & Brennan)

Career number four.

HODGINS

The nest was made by Corvus brachyrhynchos, the American Crow.

-DRENNAN

How does that help us?

Hodgins calls up a map of the area -

HODGINS

Crows never stray more than an hour's flight from the nest. Crows fly about a mile every five minutes, which means that our crow picked up the finger within 12 miles of her nest.

CONTINUED: (3)

> SCOTT STARRET

There's a spectacular copse of Japanese Flowering Cherry at the Jefferson Memorial.

HODGINS

How do you know?

> SCOTT STARRET

Career number two: Parks Supervisor.

BRENNAN

The Jefferson Memorial is eight miles from where Parker found the finger.

HODGINS

I'd say "King of the Lab" but it just depresses me.

He leaves. Scott Starret looks at Cam -

CAM

Don't ask.

CUT TO:

INT. FBI / BULLPEN - DAY

BOOTH & SWEETS' POV - PARKER

sits in Booth's office -

SWEETS (O.S.)

A human finger?

BOOTH (O.S.)

Is my son post-traumatic stressed for life?

REVEAL - BOOTH & SWEETS -

watching Parker from the bull pen -

SWEETS

He doesn't seem traumatized.

BOOTH

What about suppressed memories and denial, all that hooey?

ACT SIX

Sc.2

FADE IN:

INT. MEDICO-LEGAL LAB / HODGINS' AREA - DAY (D/3)

Hodgins and Scott Starret are sifting through the dirt from the pit of dead dogs. (Most of the larger bones have been removed already, there are smaller fragments, stones, bottle caps, etc.)

STAKE Caps, e

SCOTT STARRET
Should I be looking out for anything in particular?

HODGINS

Yes. Clues.

> SCOTT STARRET

Dr. Hodgins, is there a reason you are always so unpleasant?

Hodgins looks up at Scott, ready to bite off his head. But all he sees is a pleasant, concerned face with some miles on it. His attitude changes almost immediately -

HODGINS

I'm sorry. I... I've had some problems recently.

>SCOTT STARRET I'm sorry to hear that.

HODGINS

I... First, my best friend who used to work here, with me, he got into some big trouble and... he's locked up now and I miss him...

>SCOTT STARRET

Dr. Hodgins...

HODGINS

And Angela - you know Angela, she and I used to - we were engaged to be married and, well, that went south, too.

SCOTT STARRET That's a lot to bear.

HODGINS

I appreciate your understanding.

CONTINUED:

SCOTT STARRET Especially if you feel responsible.

HODGINS

Yes. I do. In both cases.

>SCOTT STARRET You shouldn't be talking to me about this.

Hodgins feels he's being rebuffed and begins to seal himself away again -

HODGINS

Of course not. I'm sorry.

> SCOTT STARRET

No, please, I'm not rebuffing you. It's just that I'm not the right person for you to confide in. This is my last day at the lab.

HODGINS

Right, yes. Here today, gone tomorrow.

7SCOTT STARRET

There are people around here who seem to like you very much. People who are concerned for your happiness.

Starret holds up a small, oblong OBJECT from his sifter -

7 SCOTT STARRET (CONT'D)

What's this?

HODGINS

It's a computer chip. Pet owners have them embedded in their animals in case of theft or loss. (then)

But you knew that didn't you?

Scott Starret smiles. He did know that.

CUT TO:

INT, MEDICO-LEGAL LAB - DAY

Hodgins and Starret watch as Cam runs a CHIP READER wand over the killer dog. The reader BEEPS and displays a number -

CONTINUED:

CAM

Good work, guys. It's an ID number.

> SCOTT STARRET

Ten digits.

HODGINS

The FBI can use it to track down the owner.

OCUT TO:

INT. FOI / SWEETS OFFICE - DAY (D/4)

Sweets looks up as Booth enters

BOOTH

I got a message you had something to tell me about Parker?

SWEETS

Yes, you were right. Parker is traumatized. But it has nothing to do with the finger in the nest.

воотн

There's something worse in his life than picking up a murdered man's rotting finger?

SWEETS

Yes. We has a girl problem.

BOOTH

He's s∦x

SWEETS

The problem is that a girl - her name is Stephanie Clyde and she's somewhat large apparently - she picks him up at recess and carries him around.

BOO'TH

You mean, under her arm?

SWEET

Like a pet monkey. He doesn't know what to do about it. He says you told him not to hit girls.

BOOTH

I did. Anyone. I told him not to hit anyone.
