Christmas (Kris'mas), the anniversary of the birth of Christ and its observance, is celebrated by most Protestants and Roman Catholics on that date; Eastern Orthodox churches on January 6; and by the Armenian church on January 19. The first mention of its observance on December 25 was in the times of Constantine, about A.D. 325. But, the date of Christ's birth is not known.

The word "Christmas" is formed of Christ + Mass, meaning a mass or religious service in

commemoration of the birth of Christ.

One thing we do know, Christ was born; and when celebrating Christmas, it should be in a spiritual manner. We know that a virgin was with child, a Son, and they called His name "Immanuel," which is translated, God with us. 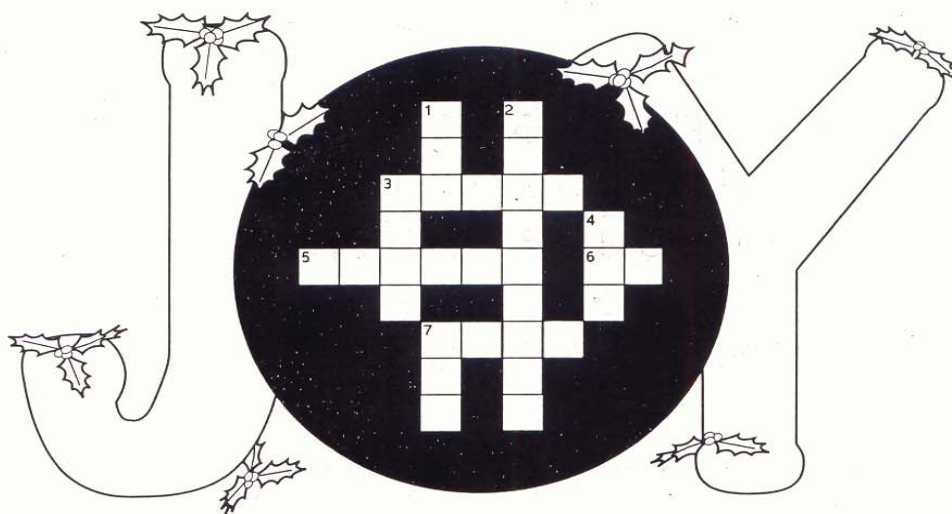

GRACIOUS SPEECH

A. Definition of Gracious Speech:

Speech: a manner of speaking.

Gracious: marked by kindness or courtesy.

Gracious speech: a manner of speaking marked by kindness or courtesy.

It's true that "a picture is worth a thousand words." It's also true that "actions speak louder than words." Nonetheless, talking to one another is still one of the primary ways we communicate. However, it's not only what we say but how and when. Sometimes it's also what not to say, or when to keep silent.

We talk so often and to so many different people in the course of a day that it could be pretty overwhelming trying to figure out if we're saying the right thing every time we open our mouths. Our focus should be on the person to whom we are speaking. What is our attitude toward him or her? Jesus gave us the guideline: the law of love.

B. What the Scriptures Have to Say About the Way We Talk to Each Other:

1. Jesus spoke rather directly to the source of the problem: how we speak is how we really are inside. We can't say, "Oh, I really do love him: while continuing to cut him down. Or sometimes we try it the other way around: we really can't stand him, but we try to cover it up with flattery or nice-sounding phrases. Neither deception works for long.

Another problem is simply thoughtlessness and bad habit. We do love such-and-such a person, but we are not aware of how our talk affects others. This is such a common problem that James says, "If any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man" (3:2, KJV). We often hurt others by what we say, or how we say it, even when we don't intend to do so.

2. The concept of openness with one another has a direct bearing on what we say to each other. One of the ways we "walk in the light" is to speak truthfully with one another. Instead of speaking behind someone's back (secrecy, darkness), we need to speak face to face (honesty, light). Instead of being so vague that no one knows for sure what we're saying, our yes should mean yes, and our no should mean no.

3. However, sometimes we get confused about this business of speaking in an open and honest way with each other. Sometimes we interpret it as saying exactly what's on our minds: "That sure is an ugly shirt you have on today." (Hey, what's the problem! I'm just being honest with the guy. That really is an ugly shirt!). But Eph. 4:15 gives us a very important qualifier to our openness with one another. "Rather, speaking the truth in love." It is love for one another which motivates and guides how we relate, and speak, to one another. The good wife in Proverbs speaks both with wisdom and kindness. Paul told the Colossians to let their speech be gracious (4:6), which Webster defines as "marked by kindness and courtesy."

Peter admonished the believers to "live as free men, yet without using your freedom as a pretext for evil" (1 Pet. 2:16). We could rephrase that and say, "Be open and honest with one another, but don't use honesty to put each other down or hurt someone else." We must always keep before us the goal of our relationships with each other as brothers and sisters in the Lord: to "grow up" into Christ, which in turn helps His body (that's all of us together!) grow and be built up in love (Eph 4:15, 16).

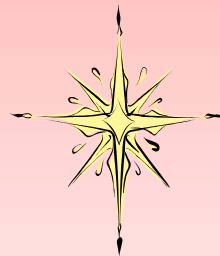
