CELEBRATE 10 YEARS OF INTENSIFIED

One of the area's most popular bands – INTENSIFIED – celebrate their 10th anniversary this year with a date at Stripes Club in Folkestone on Friday September 15th when the present line up will play their current set and then various former members of the band will be invited on stage to join the band from some old favourites.

Guaranteed to get people dancing, INTENSIFIED are really up for the challenge of keeping the authentic styles of both Jamaican ska/rocksteady and British Trojan reggae alive. Their good-time feel has earned INTENSIFIED a huge following and a reputation as one of the continent's best traditional ska/reggae bands.

The band have released two studio albums – "Faceman Sound" and "Yard Shaker" on the German-based Grover Records, as well as a compilation album "Don't Slam The Door!" of their early singles and demos. They have also released five singles and made various contributions to various ska/reggae compilation CDs around the world.

With a warm sound, catchy melodies, rich horn section and excellent vocal arrangements, INTENSIFIED follow in the tradition of Prince Buster, Skatalites, The Wailers, Derrick Morgan, Desmond Dekker and many other excellent artists who put Jamaica on the map during the 1960s.

The band have gigged extensively in both the UK and Europe and joined the likes of Jimmy Cliff, Skatalites, Asian Dub Foundation, Buju Banton, Bim Sherman and Dennis Brown at the 1998 Summer Jam in Cologne, Europe's biggest reggae festival.

Other live highlights have included Lee Thompson from Madness joining the band on stage at the University of Kent in Canterbury for renditions of "The Prince" and "Swan Lake"; legendary trombonist Rico Rodriguez playing a few songs with the band at the Dublin Castle in Camden Town; and three Leas Cliff Hall appearances – supports with Bad Manners and Pato Banton and a single release party of their own.

Stripes Club is at Folkestone Invicta Football Club in Cheriton Road – opposite the cemetery in between the Harvey Grammar School and Safeway's. It's half way between Folkestone West and Folkestone Central train stations.

The Stripes bash is intended to recreate the atmosphere of the band's first ever gig back on Thursday December 20th, 1990 when they played with Australian band THE ALLSORTS at Bottoms-on-the-Leas in Folkestone. Only three members – lead guitarist Steve Harrington, bass player Lewis Atherton (then on bass) and drummer Terry Davey remain from that first gig.

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INTENSIFIED 1990-2000

As you can read on the front page, INTENSIFIED celebrate their 10th anniversary with a party at Stripes Club in Folkestone on Friday September 15th – here is the first part of year by year run down of some of the highlights of their history to date – the second part is to come next month.

1990 After rehearsing from around summertime, INTENSIFED make their live debut at Bottoms in Folkestone on Thursday December 20th with Australian band THE ALLSORTS. The first song they play live is, believe it or not, a cover of U2's "With Or Without You". That first line up was: Steve Harrington (guitar), Lewis Atherton (guitar), Toby Day (bass), Terry Davey (drums), Phil Hancock (keyboards), Shaun Joyce (vocals), Chas Barrett (vocals) and Naomi (sax). Two days later they are early on the bill for a packed night at the Metronome in Folkestone with fellow local bands THE ROACHES, THE SMILE, HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ME, THE SHEDS and SEVERE BINGO. The year ends on a disappointing night when their New Year's Eve date at the Metronome is cancelled due to pa problems.

991 The band s busies, year to date as initial The band's busiest gigging enthusiasm kicks in and the band have to pay off instalments for a pa they've bought. They begin the year with dates at the Labour Hall, Happy Frenchman and Bottoms in Folkestone with the likes of HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ME, GURK, THE SHEDS and SOUL LIMBO (those bands featuring the likes of Jay Darlington who went on to play with Kula Shaker and the Godfrey brothers, now two thirds of Morcheeba). They also play Flatfoot Sams and County Hotel as a following begins to build up in Ashford. The band has grown with the addition of Doug Mumford (trumpet) and Lee Edigngton (washboard/percussion). Their London debit takes place at the Rock Garden in Covent Garden and they venture as far afield as Bognor and Paignton with THE HOTKNIVES, a major influence at the time with their similar dual vocalists. Dragging some many members of the band, the equipment and followers around the country means that 50-seater coaches are a feature of this period as the band play in both Chester and Coventry (the home of Two-Tone) with THE COSMICS. Football-playing keyboard man Phil Hancock is picked up after playing in an F. A. Cup tie at Gravesend en route to the Tic Toc in Coventry - with so many members of the band it's sometimes like a football team and Tom Hodges coming in for Naomi on sax is seen as a positive step. The band's horn section is further

strengthened with the arrival of Karl Wirrmann (formerly bass player with indie band THE QUENTINS) who makes his debut at the Rose Inn, Kennington and trombonist Terry "Robbo" Robinson who makes his debut in Coventry. INTENSIFIED's first anniversary sees them play with APOLLO 7 on carnival night at the Labour Hall in Folkestone. Lee Thompson from Madness joins the band on stage for renditions of "The Prince" and "Swan Lake" when INTENSIFIED support THE NUTTY BOYS at the University of Kent in Canterbury. THE COSMICS play two dates with INTENSIFIED in Folkestone, whilst the gig ends in bizarre circumstances as INTENSIFIED and THE NUTTY BOYS both get their first N.M.E. mention when Morrissey is amongst the revellers as the two bands play the George Robey in Finsbury Park on New Year's Eve.

1992 A memorable and turbulent year begins with a date at a packed Muswells in Folkestone. The band are now in a position to headline venues such as the Metronome in Folkestone (where the likes of Suede, Ocean Colour Scene and P. J. Harvey are also to play); legendary trombonist RICO RODRIGUEZ joins the band on stage at the Dublin Castle in Camden Town and the band do well at the London Ska International Festival VI at the George Robey in Finsbury Park with THE SELECTER, LAUREL AITKEN and RICO. The reformation of Two Tone legends THE SELECTER is a big deal in 1992 and INTENSIFIED support them at the Metronome in Folkestone and play the same venue with THE COSMICS. Robbo and Doug are in and out of the band as they play simultaneously with local covers band SOUL FOUNDATION, but the year is notable for the arrival of a third vocalist - Paul Carter - who makes his first appearance with the band at the County Hotel in Ashford. They record their debut single "Marguerita" at Courtfield Studios in Ashford which the band see as a major breakthrough in their intended switch from an uptempo Two Tone sound to a more laidback traditional 60s Jamaican sound. A great performance at a charity all-dayer at Lympne Place emphasises their suitability for outdoor festivals, but attempts to impress in London flounder at Gaz Mayall's club night at Gossips in Soho when the band struggle without several members. An excellent night at the Art College in Falmouth raises spirits, but trouble is just around the corner as a bout of in-fighting sees the band away from the live arena for six months in a dispute which eventually sees the departure of founder bass player Toby Day.

1993 The Toby business drags on for six months and Lewis Atherton eventually switches to bass, but Chris Rogers steps in for the early part of the year as Atherton is temporarily indisposed. The band return to the live scene with a party at Ashford Town Football Club – and there's another new member, sax player Pete McLaren. The band's debut "Marguerita" single comes out on their own SwingEasy label and is launched with another night at Bottoms in Folkestone. INTENSIFIED are on top form at the huge Sanctuary in Milton Keynes when they impress on a depleted bill with RICO AND HIS BAND and THE TROJANS. But the gremlins set in at the Cactus Club on London's Oxford Street when vocalist Carter loses his voice - that night sees the first appearance of trumpet/trombone player A.J. MacRae and also a one-off gig on bass from Tom Atherton. Another triumphal show at the annual Lympne Place charity all-dayer is a highlight, while an all-dayer at the Lanterns Hotel in Ashburton (the home of the Monster Raving Loony Party) sees the band on the wrong bill at a psychobilly bash. The band later return to Oxford Street on a night which is marred by wheelclamps and car accidents and is most notable as the last gig keyboard player Phil Hancock plays with the band. Keyboard player is to become the band's problem position. Atherton was back on board leading the singing on the minibus for an enjoyable night with MAROON TOWN, LOONY TUNES and BAKESY'S at Debonairs in Eastleigh and the year ends with a classic gig at Bottoms in Folkestone with America's DURANGO 95 and London's 100 MEN.
