Lesson 1: Root of All Evil (Read it before class)

We all know that Nepali politicians love money and power.
Multiply money by power, then our Netajis become more powerful.

$$\therefore \text{Powerful Nepali Netaji} = \text{Money} \times \text{Power}$$

We also know that power can bring money and money can buy power.

$$\therefore \text{Power} = \text{Money}$$

$$\therefore \text{Powerful Nepali Netaji} = \text{Money} \times \text{Money}$$

Which is,

$$\text{Powerful Nepali Netaji} = \text{Money}^2$$

We all know that money is the root of all evil

$$\text{Money} = \sqrt{\text{Evil}}$$

Taking the square root of evil, we get

$$\text{Money}^2 = \text{Evil}$$

Therefore, we are forced to conclude

$$\text{Powerful Nepali Netaji} = \text{Evil}$$
