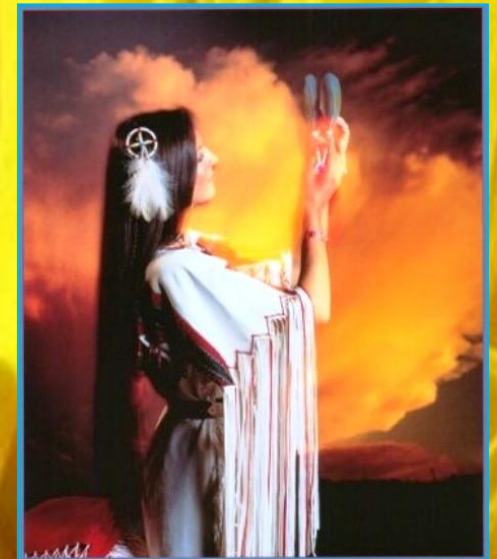

Why Storytelling?
