MARY EASLEY

OLDER DAUGHTER OF JAMES EASLY

Mary Easley, the oldest daughter of James Easly, was born on 3 May 1846 and died on 22 Feb 1868 according to information on the loose card in the J F Reilly bible.

There is a gravemarker in the James Easley plot at Guardian Angel Cemetary at Slatelick, Pa inscribed only "Mary E" with no dates whatsoever. The year 1868 was four years before the laying of the cornerstone for the present church. Some biographies imply that the congregation was in existance for many years before that and the graveyard may have been in use earlier. It is a family tradition that the grave of Joseph A Easly died Nov 24, 1864 was moved there from the Kittanning Cemetary.

In the 175th Anniversary Book for St Patricks Catholic Church - Sugar Creek there is an account of a baptism on 2 Sep 1865 of Hugh Francis Harkins, of John Harkins and Mary Easly. A Hugh Harkins is listed among Catholic settlers in the vicinity of Guardian Angel Church in the early 1800's. To date no other information has been found to link This Mary Easly to James Easly or the gravemarker at Guardian Angel Cemetary.

Mary Easly is listed in the 1860 U S Census for North Buffalo Twp Armstrong Co, Pa as "Mary Easley" a 14 year old female in the family of James Easley - family # 1100.

MARGARET EASLEY

YOUNGER DAUGHTER OF JAMES EASLY

Margaret Easley, the younger daughter of James Easly, was born on 29 Aug 1850 as recorded on the loose card in the JF Reilly bible at Vandergrift, Pa. Margaret died on 5 Sep 1935 at Windber, Pa at the age of 85.

Margaret Easley is listed as "Marg Easley" in the 1860 U S Census for North Buffalo Twp Armstrong Co Pa as a 10 year old female in the family of James Easley - family # 1100. Margaret Easley is listed in the 1870 U S Census for North Buffalo Twp Armstrong Co Pa ias a 19 year old female in the family of James Easly - family # 169.

Margaret Easley married Daniel Denny (the father-in-law of her brother John C Easley) probably in the 1870's and likely about 1875. Daniel was 32 years older than Margaret; he died in 1900.

Margaret Easley married Bernard J Dever about 1904 at St Michaels Church at Loretta, Pa. Bernard was born on 3 Oct 1871; thus he was 21 years younger than Margaret.

Margaret Easley Denny Dever is buried at St John's Catholic Cemetary at Windber, Pa. - near Johnstown, Pa.

EUGENE JAMES EASLEY

PROBABLY OLDEST SON OF JOSEPH V EASLY

Eugene James Easley, probably the oldest son of Joseph V Easly, was born on 9 Aug 1859 in Armstrong County, Pa near Kittanning, Pa. Eugene James Easley died on 14 Jan 1933 at the southern edge of Ripon, Wisc. He was 73 years of age.

Eugene James Easley is listed in the 1860 US Census for North Buffalo Township, Armstrong County, Pa page 156 as Uugen Easley a 1 year old male in the family of Joseph Easley - family # 1112.

After the death of his father, Joseph V Easly, Eugene's mother, nee Margaret Gray, went to Wisconsin with apparently her brother. - Father Eugene Gray (ordained about 1850) - and Joseph's four surviving children, likely between 1865 and 1870.

Eugene James Easley married likely between 1885 and 1887. His wife's given name was Elizabeth but her maiden surname has not been found. The couple had the following children:

Of the above five children it appears that only two married.

Robert Andrew Easley married Sarah from Fond du Lac, Wisc likely between 1910 and 1920

Joseph Easley's wife's name is not known.

Eugene James Easley visited John C Easley in Ford City, Pa about the year 1932. A neighbor was driving to Harrisburg, Pa for some personal or business reason and brought Eugene along and later stopped by to pick him up. Eugene was considering moving the grave of his father from Pennsylvania to Wisconsin. John C. explained to him what he might find in a 67 year old grave and Eugene abandoned the idea.

The author and family visited the children of Eugene Easley in Ripon, Wisconsin about 1959. A few years later, he and his wife attended the funeral of Robert Andrew Easley.

Eugene spent most of his life farming in the vicinity of Ripon, Wisc. The farmland is particularly fertile in that area with about 12 inches of black topsoil. One of Eugene's money crops was sugar beets. Eugene and Elizabeth Easley are buried at St Mary's Cemetary at Springvale, Wisconsin. Elizabeth died about 1927. Eugene sent John C Easley a tinted photograph of himself on his farm in 1932.

ANDREW EASLEY

SECOND OLDEST SON OF JOSEPH V EASLY

Andrew Easley, probably the second oldest son of Joseph V Easley, was most likely born in 1860 to 1864 considering that his name was not listed in the 1860 U S Census for North Buffalo Township, Armstrong County, Pa. and considering that his father died about 1865.

Andrew Easley accompanied his mother, nee Margaret Gray and Father Eugene Gray to Wisconsin most likely between 1865 and 1870.

Andrew Easley survived his brother Eugene James Easley since the latter's obituary stated that Andrew was living south of Ripon, Wisconsin at that time - 1933. No further information has been found on Andrew Easley.

SYLVESTER EASLEY

PROBABLY YOUNGEST SON OF JOSEPH V EASLY

Sylvester Easley, probably the youngest son of Joseph V Easley, was most likely born in the 1860 to 1864 period considering that his name was not listed in the 1860 U S Census for North Buffalo Township, Armstrong County, Pa. and considering that his father died about 1865.

Sylvester Easley accompanied his mother, nee Margaret Gray and Father Gray to Wisconsin most likely between 1865 and 1870.

Sylvester was not living at the time his brother Eugene James Easley died in 1933. According to family tradition, Sylvester died rather young probably about 1880.

MARY AGNES EASLEY

DAUGHTER OF JOSEPH V EASLEY

Mary Agnes Easley, the daughter of Joseph V Easley, was born about 1857 according to her listing in the 1860 U S Census for North Buffalo Township Armstrong County Pa as "Mary Easley" a 3 year old female in the Family of Joseph Easley - family # 1053 page 156.

Mary Agnes Easley accompanied her mother, nee Margaret Gray and Father Eugene Gray to Wisconsin most likely between 1865 and 1870.

Mary Agnes Easley married a Heaney and was living in Berlin, Wisc. in 1933 according to the obituary for Eugene James Easley. Berlin is about 10 miles west of Ripon, Wisconsin. Mrs Agnes Heaney was accordingly living at the time of Eugene James Easley's death. No further information has been found on Mary Agnes Easley Heaney.

JAMES CASPER EASLEY

OLDEST SON OF WILLIAM CASPER EASLEY

James Casper Easley, the oldest son of William Casper Easley, was born on 18 Mar 1862 and died on 28 Aug 1929.

James Casper Easley married Lydia G Stepp likely after 1880. There were no children born to the marriage.

James Casper and Lydia Stepp Easley are buried at Guardian Angel Cemetary near Slatelick, Pa. Lydia Stepp was born about 1854 and died in 1913.

ARCHIBALD FRANCIS EASLEY THIRD OLDEST SON OF WILLIAM C EASLEY

Archibald Francis Easley, the third oldest son of William Casper Easley was born on 13 Mar 1867 and died on 27 Dec 1938.

HENRY J EASLY

SECOND OLDEST SON OF JAMES C EASLY

Henry J Easly, the second oldest son of James C Easly, was born on 9 Nov 1871 in Carrolltown, Pa and died on 30 Sep 1939 according to J C Easly family records and according to his obituary in Cambria County newspapers. His death was attributed to a heart attack and his age was given as 67 years 10 months and 21 days.

Henry J Easly was listed in the 1880 U S Census for Carrolltown Borough Cambria County Pa Vol 20 E D 210 sheet 33 line 24 as "Henry Easly" an 8 year old son of James Easly.

Henry J Easly married Agnes R Koch (11 Jun 1880 - 25 Oct 1957) on 28 Jan 1903 at St Johns Pro-Cathedral at Altoona Pa, the ceremony was performed by Father Waters. Agnes R Koch was a daughter of Ferdinand Koch and of Susan McHugh of Altoona Pa.

Henry J Easly received his early education in the parochial schools of Carrolltown Pa. He later graduated from the Champion College of Embalming at Pittaburgh Pa. Following his graduation, he moved to Johnstown Pa where he was a resident at the time of the devastating flood which occurred in the 1890's. He was actively engaged in the recovery of bodies of victims of the flood.

In 1899 Henry J Easly decided to start his own business as a cabinet maker and funeral director and chose Hastings Pa in northern Cambria County for the location of a furniture store and funeral parlor. Both establishments are operating at this writing under management of Henry J's grandchildren. Henry J Easley was actively engaged as a mortician for 45 years total of which 40 were in the Hastings Pa area.

In addition to his furniture and funeral service activities, Henry J Easly was active in various civic and community affairs. He was the vice-president of the Hastings School Board, the treasurer of the Spangler Hospital, a governor of the Central Pennsylvania Funeral Directors, a member of the National Funeral Directors Association, a member of St Bernard's Church at Hastings and the treasurer of St Bernard's Cemetary Association.

In his Will written prior to 30 Sep 1939, Henry J Easly bequeathed all of his estate remaining after the payment of all debts to his Wife Agnes R Easly. His real estate - a lot and building on Bigler Avenue, Spangler Borough, Cambria County, Pa - was valued at \$600.00. His personal estate was valued at \$18,000.00 in papers attached to the Will. In her Will written prior to 25 Oct 1957, Agnes R Easly bequeathed her estate to her ten surviving children or otherwise provided for their care. Paul K Easly and Ferdinand J Easly acquired the Easly Funeral Home-Furniture establishments under specified conditions. Seven children shared in two real properties in the Borough of Hastings.

Henry J Easly is buried at St Bernard's Cemetary at Hastings Pa. His funeral services were conducted by Father Adrian, pastor of St Bernard's Church, who was assisted by Father Benedict and Father George, on 3 Oct 1939.

JOSEPH JOHN EASLY

FOURTH OLDEST SON OF JAMES C EASLY

Joseph John Easly, the fourth oldest son of James C Easly, was born on 27 Jan 1884 in Carrolltown, Pa and died 26 Mar 1921 according to J C Easly family records and according to Will of Joseph J Easly written prior to that date with the associated papers filed at the Cambria County Court House at Ebensburg. Pa.

Joseph John Easly married Ruby Warfield (born c 1885) probably between 1903 and 1913. The couple had the following children:

No information has been obtained to date on any marriages of these two children.

Joseph John Easly was a druggest in Hastings, Pa likely between the years of 1901 and 1921. Joseph J Easly, in his Will, bequeathed his entire estate to his wife "Rubie Easly" of Hastings, Cambria County, Pa. The estate was valued at \$5000. in personal property and about \$1200. in real estate - a 50 by 150 foot lot on Beaver Street in Hastings with a dwelling house on it . Joseph John Easly is buried at St Benedict's Cemetary at Carrolltown, Pa. His gravemarker reads simply " J J Easly 1884 - 1921 " .

WALTER BENEDICT EASLY YOUNGEST SON OF JAMES C EASLY

Walter Benedict Easly, the youngest son of James C Easly, was born on 20 Aug 1888 and died on 24 Jun 1936 according to J C Easly family records. Walter B Easly died of a heart attack according to his obituary in a Cambria County newspaper.

Walter Benedict Easly married Alma M Holtzman (born c 1892) on 15 Jun 1915. Alma was a daughter of Jacob Holtzman and of Mary Cullington. The couple had the following children:

Rose Marie Easly married Wilbur Boucher probably between 1932 and 1935. The Wilbur Bouchers resided in Seward, Pa in 1936.

Walter Benedict Easly had a restaurant in Seward, Pa sand was a former Burgess of Seward. Walter Benedict Easly was a caterer in Johnstown Pa in 1915 as recorded on his marriage license application. Walter Benedict Easly is buried at St Benedict Cemetary at Carrolltown Pa. His gravemarker reads: "Walter B Easly 1889 - 1936".

MARY BERNADETTE EASLY OLDEST DAUGHTER OF JAMES C EASLY

Mary Bernadette Easly, the oldest daughter of James C Easly, was born on 12 Oct 1873 in Carrolltown Pa according to J C Easly family records. She died on 37 Feb 1940 near Dade City, Florida.

Mary Bernadette his listed as "Mary B Easly" and year old daughter of James Easly in the 1880 U S Census for Carrolltown Borough, Cambria County, Pa Vol 20 E D 210 Sheet 33 Line 24.

Mary Bernadette Easly presumably did not dream of becoming a nun in her early years but she received her early schooling from the Benedictine Sisters at Carrolltown Pa and her mother did have two sisters who belonged to the Benedictine Order- Sister Marie Dolores Scanlon and Sister Dolorosa Scanlon.

In 1881, when Mary Bernadette became 8 years old, an Edmund F Dunne acquired an option on 50,000 acres of Florida land as payment in kind for legal services to Hamilton Disston of Philadelphia in his purchase of four million acres of Florida state lands. This Mr Dunne was an Irish Catholic with a dream of establishing a "Catholic Colony" in central Florida. The center of the colony was to be called San Antonio and it was to be surrounded by eight farming villages such as St Leo and St Joseph with the intervening lands devoted to farming. By 1889 a branchline of the railroad from Jacksonville had reached San Antonio on the way to St Petersburgh.

About 1889 Mr Dunne offered a large hotel building (The Sultenfuss) to the Benedictine Sisters of Pittsburgh Pa to establish a convent and girl's academy in his colony of San Antonio. The Sisters elected Sister Dolorosa Scanlon to be Mother Superior of this convent in Florida. Mother Dolorosa along with four other Benedictine nuns made the journey to Florida and immediately set about taking over the teaching duties at the already-established parochial school at San Antonia. In this same year, Sister Marie Dolores Scanlon died rather suddenly. To console Mother Dolorosa, Mrs Easly sent Mary Bernadette to visit the convent in San Antonia. Within a rather short time Mary Bernadette decided that she had a vocation to the religious life and asked to be received into the community. She was solemnly received into the Benedictine Order on February 10 1890 and invested with the the religious habit by Bishop John Moore of St Augustine, FL. and received the name Sister Rose Marie, O.S.B.

Mother Dolorosa Scanlon, O.S.B., after a mere 6 years at San Antonio, became seriously ill and died June 2, 1895 at Johnstown, Pa. Mother Boniface Feldman O.S.B. headed the convent for the next three years-1895 to 1898.— while Sister Rose Marie had been conducting a school at Quincy, Florida from 1892 to 1898. In 1898 Sister Rose Marie was elected prioress of the convent and recalled to San Antonio.

Sister Rose Marie Easly O.S.B. was only 25 years old when first elected prioress of the convent at San Antonio, Florida. She held the office continuously until her death excepting three years between 1921 and 1924 and the two years immediately preceding her death 1938 to 1940. There were but nine Sisters and one novice when Mother Rose Marie took over the government of the community. At the time of her death, there were more than 40 members in the community.

Mother Rose Marie had her dreams for the community just like Edmund Dunne had his dream of a Catholic Colony in Florida. Mother Rose Marie had speculated for years on the feasibility of moving the convent building - pictured as two 3-story wings connected together by a 2-story central section - from San Antonio up the hill to St Leo where the community had acquired a 50-acre plot of land adjacent to Lake Jovita. Amid much much skepticism, a Mr Reed and a Mr Snead undertook this task about 1910 during summer vacation. The move was accomplished using a combination of machinery and horse and oxen teams. The building was occupied by several nuns and about a dozen students during the entire move.

Mother Rose Marie studied expression or elocution at the Shoemaker School of Oratory in Philadelphia. She was also versatile in music - both vocal and instrumental. Even while carrying the burden of being the Superior of the community, she taught music, elocution and classical subjects to the students. In her time Holy Name Academy operated as a private girls' school and included both elementary and high school grades. In 1920, the nuns also opened a boys school for grades 1 through 6 - it was known as St Benedict's Preparatory.

Adjoining Holy Name Academy grounds are the grounds of St Leo College which was also founded about 1889; its founders were Benedictine Fathers of Latrobe, Pa. who operated St Leo Academy as a secondary school for boys. About 1960, St Leo Academy became St Leo College and shortly thereafter became coeducational. Holy Name Academy then closed and the Benedictine nuns turned to housing college age girls in a new modern-design residence hall while the Benedictine nuns became members of the faculty of the College.

The old frame convent which Mother Rose Marie had had moved up the hill with so much effort was demolished about 1940. Holy Name Convent is now known as Holy Name Priory. The boys school was closed and the building was demolished about 1959. Much has changed at St Leo in the 47 years since Mother Rose Marie's death. But in the years before Women's Lib became an in-thing, Mother Rose Marie Easly displayed great managerial skills in both the development of the physical plant and of the personnellorganization of this society. Mother Rose Marie Easly and the numerous other Benedictine nuns provided teaching sisters to numerous parochial schools in Florida and elsewhere. Perhaps the number of Benedictine nuns has declined recently, but there are still Benedictine Sisters at Holy Name Priory and several of them still remember Mother Rose Marie Easly. - whose gravemarker is in a little private cemetary behind the College.

MARY ELIZABETH EASLY

SECOND OLDEST DAUGHTER OF JAMES C EASLY

Mary Elizabeth Easly, the second oldest daughter of James C Easly, was born on 28 Dec 1877 according to J C Easly family records at Carrolltown Pa. She died on 24 Feb 1950 also according to family records, aged 72 years.

Mary Elizabeth is listed as "Elizabeth Easly" a 2 year old daughter of James Easly in the 1880 U S Census for Carrolltown Borough, Cambria County, Pa Vol 20 E D 210 Sheet 33 Line 24.

Mary Elizabeth Easly married John F Hurley on 16 Jun 1902 at St Benedict's Church at Carrolltown Pa. The attendants were Dennis Murphy and Gertrude Easly a sister of the bride. Rev P Emmeran O S B performed the ceremony. The couple took a wedding trip to New York City and then returned to set up housekeeping at Carrolltown Pa. John F Hurley was a son of Daniel Hurley and Eliza Hayes. He was born on 10 Apr 1870 in Blossburg Tioga County Pa.

John F Hurley served for two and a half terms as Tax Collector of Carrolltown Borough. He was also a Clerk of Council and had served on the School Board. John F Hurley died on 14 Jan 1936 aged 65. GERTRUDE EASLY

THIRD OLDEST DAUGHTER OF JAMES C EASLY

M Gertrude Easly, the third oldest daughter of James C Easly, was born on 4 Sep 1882 at Carrolltown Pa according to J C Easly family She died on 12 Jan 1974 at Miners Hospital at Spangler Pa. She was the last surviving member of the James C Easly immediate family.

M Gertrude Easly was "Aunt Gertrude" to many nieces and nephews. She was an employee of First National Bank of Carrolltown from 1920 to 1955. Gertrude resided for many years with Donald and Virginia Mohler of Carrolltown Pa. Gertrude was a member of St Benedict's Church at Carrolltown and active in several church organizations -Altar-Rosary Society, Purgatorial Society, Extension Society, and the Third Order Regular as a secular member.

M Gertrude Easly made several trips to San Antonio, Florida to visit her two sisters who were nuns at Holy Name Academy there. One newspaper account datelined Feb 28 Carrolltown (probably in the 1920's) states that she and a Miss Hattie Pruner of Ebensburg traveled to Philadelphia where they embarked on a Merchants and Miners' Line steamer for Jacksonville, Florida from which they rode by rail to San Antonio to visit Mother Rose Marie Easly and Sister Mary Easly.

M Gertrude Easly is buried at Carrolltown St Benedict's Cemetary. Her gravemarker reads " M Gertrude Easly 1882 - 1974 " .

MARY AGNES EASLY

YOUNGEST DAUGHTER OF JAMES C EASLY

Mary Agnes Easly, the youngest daughter of James C Easly, was born on 20 Aug 1886 at Carrolltown Pa according to J C Easly family records. She died probably on 19 Mar 1956 at the age of 69.

Mary Agnes Easly entered Holy Name Convent in Florida as a postulant 1 Jan 1906 at the age of 19. She made her temporary vows as a Sister of St Benedict on 14 Sep 1907 and pronounced her perpetual vows on 8 Dec 1910. Her given name in religious life was Sister Mary Easly O.S.B.

Sister Mary Easly taught in the primary grades at St Anthony School at San Antonio, Florida as a young Sister. She later taught at Holy Name Academy until about 1917. She had the reputation of being an effective teacher. However, with the outbreak of World War I, her talents were needed elsewhere.

GRANDCHILDREN OF GEORGE W EASLY

In 1889, when Holy Name Convent was established, there were no standing citrus trees on the property allocated to the Benedictine Sisters. A few years later, a friendly farmer named Rhode gave the nuns one orange tree located four miles from the Convent. This tree, the nuns cared well for and Mr Rhode then gave them slips to plant to start new trees. Other farmers made similar donations and the nuns had the nucleus of a citrus grove along with their other farming and gardening efforts.

With the outbreak of World War I, agricultural products became a critical item in the United States economy. Food prices rose, the government allocated critical items like wheat flour to the war effort and suggested various substitions to the populace at large. Some special considerations were given to persons actively engaged in agriculture to bolster the food supply. Under these conditions Mother Rose Marie Easly asked Sister Mary to take over the management of Holy Name Convent's farm and the supervision of the convent kitchen and of the academy kitchen.

During the 1920's a substantial portion of the 50 acres of ground surrounding the Holy Name Academy and Convent was set out in citrus groves. A postal card with the date 1926 marked on the top border shows these groves as an aeroplane view. When the groves were first started, the Sisters of the Convent worked the fields, fertilizing, pruning and cultivating the groves. On one occasion, a local farmer was financially indebted to the Sisters for Academy tuition for his daughters; to settle the debt he offered to have his hired hands replace an oak grove on the property with citrus trees. Eventually the citrus groves became a commercial operation and a full-sized business venture and the nuns hired contract workers to take care of the actual grove work.

About 1935, Sister Mary was appointed Supervisor of the Academy Citrus Groves and the shipping department. Citrus shipment started out in the form of gifts from the Sisters to benefactors. About 1941, Sister Mary Easly went commercial on shipping fruit and increased the income of the school. By the early 1950's the commercial sale or bulk sale of fruit plus the shipped fruit provided about half of the school's income; student's tuition provided the other half. At their peak, the groves included acres of Hamlin, Valencia, Navel, Parson Brown and Temple oranges in addition to Marsh seedless grapefruit, satsumas and kumquats. The Academy is a member of the Citrus Mutual. Fruit shipping occurred over 10 months of the year but peaked in December. At the peak, Sister Mary was said to work 14 hours a day personally packing each box of fruit leaving the school although she had the help of three other nuns in washing and sorting the fruit.

Sister Mary Easly O S B was described as about 5 feet tall. Working extensively in the fields she was much exposed to the elements and was said to have been struck by lightning. Sister Mary Easly is buried at St Leo cemetary about a half mile from the Holy Name Priory as it is now called. The groves were still prosperous in 1980; however, the severe freezes of 1984 and 1985 likely reduced their productivity substantially.
