

Camp marks return of Navy Vets

WOODSTOCK — This weekend marks the return of the Woodstock Navy Vets, as the Junior C team holds its spring evaluation camp this weekend.

Forty-three players were registered as of yesterday afternoon, all hoping to get noticed before training camp begins in late August. After another first-round playoff exit, returning players were encouraged to attend the camp. So far, goalie Neil Pit-

tock, defencemen Andy Fallowfield and Devon Young, and forwards Craig Thomson, Travis Horvath and Spencer Sweazey are all expected to participate in the camp.

This will mark the first on-ice session for the franchise since its rebirth as the Navy Vets following three seasons as the Renegades.

In addition to the watchful eyes of Navy Vets' head coach Bob Langdon, and assistants Keli Corpse and Steve Aichmayr (who is also the goalie coach), representatives from the Cambridge Winter Hawks will

also be in attendance to scout players. The Navy Vets recently announced an affiliation with the Junior B club, which is the team's first with a Junior B squad since Woodstock's partnership with the Stratford Cullitons.

Camp will run Saturday at Southwood Arena from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m., and Sunday from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Cost is \$100 and includes four games, food and fitness evaluations.
