



- **When:** July/August 2010
- **Duration:** 3 weeks
- **Who can apply:** All active uniformed members of East Sussex Scouts who are currently under 25 years of age and will be 16 or over on 1st August 2010.
- **How do I apply:** Complete and submit the application form attached, along with a photograph, passport style, by 11th May 2008.
- **How can I join the team:** Be selected at the team selection event on 25/26th May 2008
- **What will we do:** Work hard, play hard, and then work hard some more! Meet and work alongside the local Street Scouts, and then do things like, Safari, The Ark, Fisherman's Camp, and other tourist activities.



WHAT IS HAPPENING IN 2010

East Sussex Scouting has had specific links with Scouting in Kenya since our first project in 2000. There have been many other projects undertaken in Kenya since then. Some in the original location, whilst others have gone to different areas to help numerous people in need. Unfortunately finding people who need help is one area where we have plenty of choice.

A group of Explorer Scouts and Network Scouts went to Nyeri in 2006 and built a Scout hut for the use of the local Street Scouts. The hut was built to a stage where the walls were up and the roof was in place. They also taught the Kenyans how to make, maintain, and operate pole lathes, simple, low maintenance, wood turning lathes.

Again we will be going to Kenya to help the Street Scouts and the location will again probably be Nyeri so that the project work already undertaken there can be continued. This will however depend greatly the result of investigations we are currently making, and of course on the political situation out there. At the time of writing things seem to be calming down, and of course it is 2 years before we go.

WHO CAN GO

The project is open to all active uniformed members of East Sussex Scouts, who are currently under 25 and will be over 16 on 1st August 2010.

There will be published dates for team building events and dates when installments are due.

You will be expected to attend the team building events and to ensure that your installments are paid

in a timely manner.

For the avoidance of doubt, if you are 18 or over CRB (Criminal Records Bureau) clearance is mandatory.



TEAM SELECTION WEEKEND

The team selection event is on 25th/26th May 2008 and is taking place at Broadstone Warren Scout Camp. It is open to anyone who meets the criteria above. There is a £10 fee for the event to cover costs. The start time is 10:00 on Sunday 25th May and will finish at 15:00 on Monday 26th May.

Upon arrival, at Broadstone Warren look out for signs directing you where to go to check in.

You will be expected to arrive in full uniform.

You will need to provide your own tentage, sleeping bags etc. All refreshments and food that you may need will be provided.

The purpose of the team selection day is simply so that the project leaders can get to know everyone before selecting the team that will go to Kenya.

There will be a presentation on our past experiences in Kenya and on the planned project in 2010. This will start at 14:00, in the resource center to which parents are most welcome.

You will be notified within 2 weeks as to whether you have been successful or not in your application.
