Roadside work on the extreme south end of West Shore Boulevard should continue for a few more weeks.

Two weeks ago, city crews began moving water lines on the east side of the road between Prescott and McCoy streets in advance of a road-widening project.

More work is ahead for West Shore Circle.

The work, unrelated to South Tampa's ongoing water line replacement project, should conclude by late October, said Mark Oural, chief engineer for the Tampa Water Department.

The road widening, from Gandy to Interbay boulevards, is expected to begin by the end of the year.
