

One civil case is in progress now and there are other civil cases scheduled. Starrett also expects a heavy criminal term with arraignment proceedings beginning today.

"There's been a terrible increase in juvenile crime, and it's obvious the drug problem stills exists," Starrett said about expected cases.

"It's going to be a busy, busy term of court this time," Starrett said.

According to the final January grand jury report, grand jurors heard testimony from 100 witnesses and

returned a total of 114 indictments between January and August. A total of 14 cases were continued for the next grand jury and five cases were remanded to lower courts for dispositions.

On a lighter note, Starrett said former Brookhaven Police Capt. Irvin Roberson, who recently retired after 30 years with the department, has been appointed as courtroom deputy. The judge said Roberson will be a great asset and will help maintain security in the courtroom.
