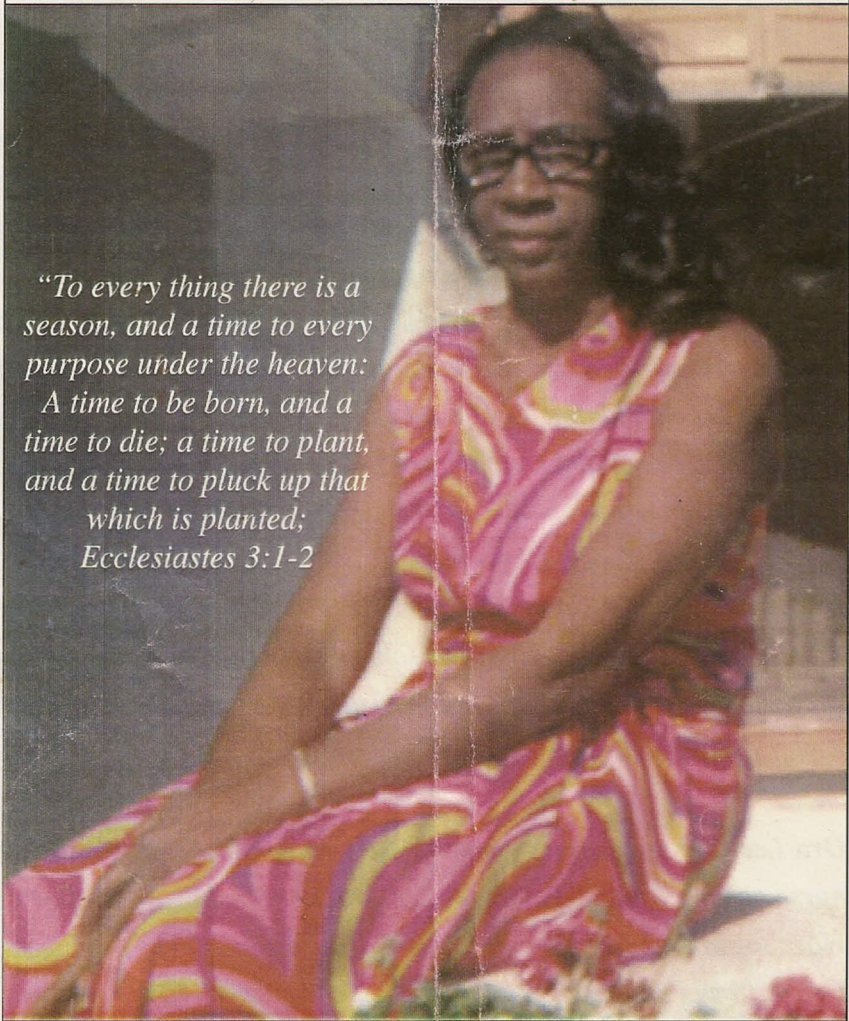

Obituary

Ora Lee Markham Johnson was born in Caseyville, MS. on October 10, 1910 to the late John Markham and Ida Blue Markham.

Ora Lee accepted Christ at an early age and united with the Galilee A.M.E. Church at Caseyville, MS. and was a faithful member until she later moved her membership to Mt. Wade Missionary Baptist Church in Brookhaven, MS. She later moved to Jackson, MS. and united with Cottage Hill Missionary Baptist Church. After leaving Jackson, she moved to Los Angeles, CA. and united with Jeniah Church of God, there she worked faithfully in the church and choir until she became ill and was no longer able to attend.
