

Prescious Adams Reed

Services for Prescious Adams Reed of Brookhaven are April 10 at 11 a.m. at Mt. Wade M.B. Church with burial in Old Macedonia 550 Cemetery.

Visitation is April 9 from noon to 5 p.m. at Williams' Mortuary. A family hour will be held April 10 from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. at the church.

Mrs. Reed, 50, died April 5, 1993, at King's Daughters Hospital. She was born in Lincoln County on Aug. 22, 1942, to Louis Adams and Edna Adams, who preceded her in death.

Mrs. Reed was one of three Lincoln Countians selected to participate in the Promoting Rural Opportunity in Mississippi (PRO-MISS) Program. "We are really going to miss Prescious. She was a nice lady," Carol Hollahd of Lincoln County, one of the PRO-MISS participants said today. "She had a lot to offer Brookhaven."

Holland said she, Mrs. Reed and Mike Windham were working on a grant for Brookhaven entitled "B-LINC," in an effort to establish a resource data center. This project was part of their participation in PRO-MISS — which is an intensive 15-month educational program that includes seminars, workshops, demonstrations, study tours, independent study and a final project to address an existing problem in the community.

The program, which began in September, is being coordinated locally by the Brookhaven/Lincoln County Chamber of Commerce and the Lincoln County Extension Service office. Mrs. Reed was scheduled to complete the program in November.

Mrs. Reed was also a member of the Homemakers' Club, the Jolly Giant Club, and the Christian Women's Club, and was a past president of the Alexander Jr. High School PTA. She was a member of Mt. Wade M.B. Church.

Survivors are one son, Preston Reed of Brookhaven; one daughter, Dana Reed of Brookhaven; four sisters, Lillie Rucks, Lucille Dixon and Lena Henderson, all of Brookhaven, and Annie Johnson of Dallas, Texas; and three brothers, Albert Adams and Clifton Adams, both of Brookhaven, and Louis Adams of New Orleans, La.
