In all seriousness, I've grown to really appreciate the positive environment the Y promotes: caring, honesty, respect, and responsibili-



ty. But have you ever noticed that the "C" in their name is hardly promoted? Their mission is to "Promote Christian values by..." but rarely will you ever see the words Christian, God, Jesus, prayer, etc... promoted – just the values Christ displayed. Is this so bad?

At a recent all-school parents meeting, the board president challenged parents, teachers and students alike not to hide behind the acronym LCS, but to emphasize the

Keep praying that L-CHRISTIAN-S will continue to ground itself in the truth of God's word and will unabashedly promote His word in the light of His world in every single class, in every single student. We don't want to be a school that simply "promotes Christian values by..." but a school that "promotes Christ by...." The difference is subtle yet substantial.

What's New at Lincoln Christian School

TG od is a generous provider. He is doing so many awesome things at Lincoln Christian that we can't begin to praise Him enough. First of all, God is keeping His Holy Word at the center of the curriculum and He is calling His people to teach in a way that honors Him. We have seen Him at work as students come to know Christ as Savior and Lord, as they grow in Him, as they learn through tough times, and as they fill us with thankfulness for their successes.

Some new things that we are thanking God for:

- Lincoln Christian now has a pre-school headed by Mrs. Melody Kugel. There are three sessions per week with about 29 students enrolled.
- The board has approved a comprehensive building plan that includes roof repair,



finishing the last of the unfinished portion of the elementary school, installing new HVAC in the academic wing of the secondary school, turning the first annex into a weight room, and completion of the grounds plan to the south of the football field. Donations and some money from the street improvement project along 84th and Old Cheney have given a great start to the fund-raising, but we need additional donors.

- Lincoln Christian School hosted 650 people for a Worldview Weekend in October. National level speakers included David Noebel of Summit Ministries, Sean McDowell, Kerby Anderson, David Barton of Wallbuilders, and Scott Lindsey.
- We are now in the first year of a need-based scholarship system that has made

it possible for some families to attend Lincoln Christian that would not have been able to otherwise. We are continuing to seek funding to expand this program as God provides.

- Technology continues to be a focal point for the Crusaders. We have added more than fifty new computers, a new server, new web-based student information software, and new Bible research software.



TCOB Wrapped Up

The completion of the Taking Care of Business campaign ended with a BANG as Lincoln Christian School was able, by the grace of God, to secure the \$300,000 matching gift which was announced last Spring. This concludes a year and a half effort on behalf of the entire school family to literally "take care of business."

Some of the highlights of the campaign include:

- Retention climbing back to 94% from 87% just two years ago;
- Over 100 new students each of the last two years plus the inception of a new pre-school this year;
- Nearly \$1 million in fundraising and gifts in addition to the \$300,000 matching gift designated as an endowment; and
- Numerous examples of families stepping up to volunteer in a variety of important areas throughout the school.

While we are excited and thankful for what God has done, we are eager to meet the challenges ahead of us. Please be in prayer for OUR school and consider how you can make a difference through your ongoing support and involvement in Lincoln Christian School.
