A Message from Pastor Marc

"Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry"." -Luke 4:1-2 NIV



It is hard to believe that Winter is fleeting and Spring is a mere three weeks away. We long for longer and warmer days that the new season promises. We have now entered the season of Lent, that time commemorating the inauguration of Jesus' earthly ministry. We remember how Jesus was in the wilderness, led by the Holy Spirit, where He went without food or water. And being tempted by Satan, rebuked the tempter three times by quoting Scripture and for which Satan had no reply.

While traditions vary among the various denominations, the central focus is one of introspection upon one's relationship to our risen Savior. There may be personal signs of reverence to our Lord. Some periodically fast during this time, others deny certain foods or activities as a sign of personal sacrifice. others may make daily prayer a priority during this time or read a devotional that focuses on Christ's passion. If these activities help you focus on Jesus and what He has done for us, then I believe they are excellent activities.

One of the most interesting activities of the early church was the process of instructing the prospective converts or Catechumen to Christianity. While these prospective converts could attend the local community's Christian service they were asked to leave when Communion was being offered. During the period of Lent, the individuals would receive instruction about what it meant to follow Jesus. On Easter morning they were baptized by the local community, welcomed into it and received Communion as a full participating member. It was an exciting time as the local believers fulfilled their call of the Great Commission.

Today, there is so much in our society that calls us to minimize the importance of Lent. Do we take for granted what the Lord has done on our behalf? Are we taking time everyday to be with Jesus and to thank Him for the blessings we get daily? During this time of introspection, I ask that you make it personal. Remember what the Lord our God did for us and on our behalf. We are a broken people who live within a broken world, but thanks be to God through the blood of Jesus He has made us whole. He has cleansed us of all unrighteousness, and He now calls us His own. Think about that daily, read Deuteronomy. 6:4-9 as a focal point. Never forget what the Lord has done for us.

God bless you all this Lenten season.




On March 6 at 8:30 am, we are expecting a visit from Sen. Fattman who is coming to view our historic church.

Salvation by Grace

God's salvation comes by grace through faith: "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Eph 2:8–9). Both grace and faith are needed for salvation.

Salvation saves us from the penalty of sin and guarantees us eternal life in heaven with God (John 3:16–18). Many religions teach that salvation is achieved by things that we can do; they imply that we can be good enough to earn it, or that if we are sorry enough for our bad actions everything will be okay. No matter how good our intentions or actions are, they are not enough on their own. While we should do good works and have contrition over our shortcomings, this is not enough to free us from the curse of sin we

inherited from Adam in the Garden of Eden. We need to be delivered from the curse of sin. God's grace provides the deliverance we need.

Grace is God's unmerited favor which He freely bestows on us (Romans 3:24). He loves us so He provides grace that enables us to receive the gift of salvation through Christ: "But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved" (Ephesians 2:4–5).

When we accept His gift of grace, it vindicates us and frees us from the power of sin. We are no longer separated from God or sentenced to hell, because His grace covers us and makes us sinless in His sight. We accept the gift of His eternal salvation by grace through faith.
